## New Materials Beginning to Appear at the Branches

Hundreds of new items have been pouring into the library's branches and are waiting to be checked out. The number of fiction authors whose books are being purchased by the library has doubled this spring and now includes well-known authors such as Elizabeth Gilbert, Sophie Hannah, and Richard Price. In addition, the quantity of each title has increased. Books haven't been the only new items reaching the branches. Recently-released movies and television shows can also be borrowed, such as *St. Vincent*, *Gone Girl*, *Big Hero 6*, and *Downton Abbey: Season 5*. Electronic resources have also experienced a dramatic expansion. E-book users will find that over 500 new titles have been added to the library's Overdrive collection last month. The titles include *American Sniper*, *The Girl on the Train*, *All the Light We Cannot See*, and *Gray Mountain*.

## Book Deliveries Begin to Area Preschools

Scenic Regional Library recently received a grant from the Missouri State Library\* to purchase canvas bags for a new service to preschools in Franklin, Gasconade and Warren Counties. The library currently visits preschools to do storytimes and will now be offering to deliver and pick up library books to those facilities, too. Through this service the library can expose children to a wider variety of age-appropriate children's books, supplementing the books already provided by the preschools. The grant funds were used to purchase book delivery bags personalized with the library logo, so that the bags can remain at the schools as a mini-Scenic Regional Library branch. The library will continue the book delivery program as a regular service once the grant cycle is complete. If you know of a preschool or daycare in your area that is not currently receiving library storytimes or book delivery, please contact your local Scenic Regional Library branch.

## Outreach to Adult Residential Centers

The library has been undergoing many changes over the past few months. One of the services that we've wanted to add this year is outreach to adult day cares, assisted living centers, nursing homes, and similar facilities. In the past month, the Union branch has had requests from 18 different facilities for adult outreach services in Union and Washington alone.

Due to this tremendous demand, the library has created a new position, Adult Outreach Specialist, and hired Union staff member Laurie Osseck (seen standing) for the position. Laurie has been part-time at the Union branch for the past couple years and has done a great job providing adult outreach in Union and

Washington over the past couple months. She will provide outreach to adult day cares, assisted living centers, nursing homes, and other facilities throughout our entire system. Her programs include music, singing, reminiscing, and trivia contests. If you know

of a center that would like to have a librarian visit, contact your branch library. Laurie will also be setting up and managing our new Books-by-Mail service for homebound people over the coming months.

Laurie's first

day in the position will be Monday, April 20.
