The goal of outreach is to bring library resources to people who can't travel to the library.



In the past, most of the library's outreach was done by the bookmobile and our professional staff in Union. As a result, the library was limited in terms of

they could go. In the past year, we've hired some additional part-time staff at all our locations, which has allowed the library's branch staff to get out into their communities. It's made an enormous difference in the amount of outreach services we can provide. Our branch staff is presenting storytimes at day cares and preschools; signing children up for new library cards at schools; delivering books and reading at nursing homes, adult day cares, and assisted living centers; working tables at fairs and expos; and many other outreach activities. In addition, our branch managers and other staff have been talking to organizations to get the word out about all the new and existing services offered by the library. The Scenic Regional Library has a new online book club. Members will read and discuss books from the Modern Library's 100 Best Novels of the past century. The titles include classic works like *The Grapes of Wrath* by John Steinbeck, *1984* by George Orwell, *A Farewell to Arms* by Ernest Hemingway, *Lord of the Flies* by William Golding, *The Catcher in the Rye* by J.D. Salinger, and *The Call of the Wild* by Jack London.

An online book club is a great option for busy people who don't have time to show up at the library for a book club meeting. Members will discuss the books on a message board on the library's website. The August



book selection for the group will be *On the Road* by Jack Kerouac; *The Sound and the Fury* by William Faulkner will be discussed in September. Participants can pick up copies of upcoming books at their local Scenic Regional branch. The book discussions begin on the 15th of each month. Library Director Steve Campbell will moderate the discussions.

Missouri's First Seed Library Opens for Business at the Hermann Branch

If you're planning on making a stop at the Hermann Library to return books or pick up requests, don't leave without stopping to check out its newest addition - the Seed Library!

Currently the Library is offering more than 75 varieties of heirloom, organic seeds to patrons planning their gardens.

"Many of the seeds we offer come to us from Seed Savers Heritage Farm, a special not-for-profit program sponsored by Seed Savers Exchange," said Sheri Hausman, Hermann branch manager. "Others have come to us from area gardeners who can certify their seeds varieties are healthy, keeping genetic diversity and age-old gardening heritage alive."

The Seed Library works very simply; patrons come into the library, check out seeds, grow their crop, and at the end of the growing season they harvest and return seeds for the coming year. "There will be lots of help along the way,"

said Hausman. "We're already planning a series of gardening presentations to share what we learn with emphasis on different aspects of the growing season. At the moment we're simply checking out seeds. We have everything from Long Island Cheese Squash, introduced in 1807 and named for its resemblance to a wheel of cheese, to Ponderosa Red Tomatoes and Velvet Queen Sunflowers. We hope this becomes self-perpetuating."

Since its inception in April, a total of twenty-eight home gardeners have checked out a total of 173 packages of heirloom seeds. For more information, call Brittany or Sheri at 573-486-2024 or visit the Hermann branch.

Database Spotlight LearningExpress

LearningExpress Library is a free database that can help people of all ages learn new skills, improve existing skills, and prepare for tests.

It features skill-building tutorials, as well as online practice tests, for a wide range of subjects. The database times the tests and scores your answers to provide immediate results. LearningExpress includes practice tests for popular standardized tests such as the ACT, PSAT, ASVAB, and SAT; tutorials and practice tests for math and reading skills are available for elementary school-age students; and preparation material and practice tests for the math, reading, and writing sections of the GED exam. However, LearningExpress isn't just for students.



People in the workforce will also find valuable resources in the database. It also provides practice tests and skill-building for vocational career certification such as Real Estate licensing, Commercial Driver's License, Electrician's License Test Preparation, State Trooper/Highway Patrol Exam Preparation, and many other fields. Additionally, it offers tutorials for popular software, such as Adobe Photoshop, Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel, and many more. Job seekers will even find resources to improve their business writing, job searching, resume-writing, and interviewing skills.

Learning Express Library can be accessed from our database page, scenicregional.org/ databases. To log in, enter the first 9 digits of your library card number as your username, and 63084 plus the first 9 digits of your library card number as the password. Anyone with a valid Scenic Regional Library card can access this database 24/7 from anywhere with an internet connection. Library users who need assistance accessing any Scenic Regional online database can contact their local branch.

New Online Catalog Computers

Over the next few months, the library will be replacing its existing online catalog computers with all-in-one computers.





With the all-in-one computer, the hard drive is built into the monitors. In addition, the new online catalog computers will be mounted on the end panels in the shelving areas as seen in the photo. The main reason that the library decided to make the change is space; the library has several small branches and the all-in-one computers take up much less space.
