Library Consolidation Moves Forward

In September, the boards of the three county library districts that make up Scenic Regional Library approved resolutions to consolidate—combine into a single district.

Since 1959, the Franklin, Warren, and Gasconade County Library Districts have operated as a single entity, but were only held together by an agreement. From a legal standpoint, the district did not exist as a political subdivision. As a result, it could not obtain the bonds necessary to construct new buildings.

The next step in the consolidation process involved obtaining approval from each county's Commission. The Warren and Gasconade County Commissions approved the request in late October, while the Franklin County Commission wanted to examine the measure more closely. In mid-November, the Franklin County Commissioners said that they will approve the request at some point in December.

The final steps in the process will be to place a legal notice in the newspapers announcing the consolidation and notify the Missouri State Library. Once completed, Scenic Regional Library will be a single district effective July 1, 2015.



This holiday season the Hermann Branch is participating in the local Giving Tree program.

Dawn Grosse, social worker with the Gasconade County R-1 school district, organized the program for Hermann's students and their families several years ago to provide winter supplies or Christmas presents to local residents who struggle financially.



The Hermann Branch staff has decorated their Giving Tree with ornaments. On the reverse side of each ornament is a number and three item list. As these items are purchased and returned to the Branch, the staff will affix the filled ornament list to the item, and then store the items for pickup by Ms. Grosse.

The items on the ornaments are primarily for children and include shoes, Barbie dolls, picture books, mittens, scarves, Legos, puzzles, and blankets. The tree will be on display at the library until December 15.

Pacific Branch Wraps-up Successful Coat Drive

The Pacific Branch participated in the annual Warner's Warm-Up Coat Drive November 1-14. The Branch collected almost 50 coats during the two-week drive. The Warners' Warm-Up Team has been able to provide warm winter outerwear to men, women, and children in need in the Bi-State area for thirteen years. The group has hundreds of drop off locations on both sides of the river resulting in approximately 15,000 coats collected each year. Operation Food Search, St. Louis's largest free food and personal care non-profit distribution center, distributes the coats collected to their network of schools, shelters and social service centers.
