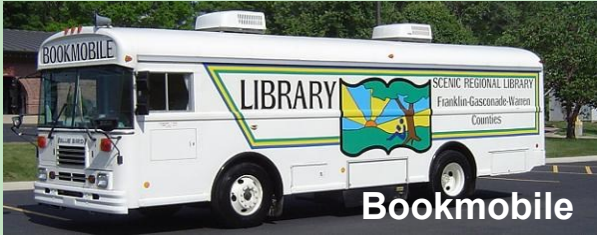

# 2014 Statistics

## Program Statistics

2,521 children, 335 teens and 916 adults participated in the Summer Reading Program.

2,232 children and 1,414 adults attended library storytimes.

27,991 children and 12,074 adults participated in other programs sponsored by Scenic Regional Library, including school programs.

395 adult programs were attended system wide by 4,515 adults and 306 children.

629 adults participated in 90 book clubs.

## New Materials

14,711 books, talking books, videos, DVDs, music CDs and magazines were added to the collection. 954 e-books and 394 e-audiobooks were added.

## Databases

140,354 searches on library subscription databases and 706 online tutoring sessions.

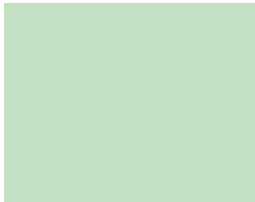
# Children & Teen Programs

Children build and play with LEGOs at the Warrenton branch's "Read, Build, Play" program on July 29.



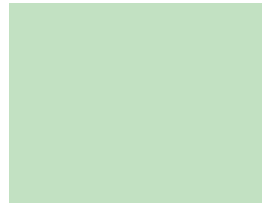
# Children & Teen Programs
