Grant Writing 101 at Union Branch

Kent Hornberger, a certified grant professional, will discuss the entire grant-writing process, including how to gather and prepare preliminary information, clearly state grant goals, evaluate the project, and develop a budget.

Mr. Hornberger has over 40 years of experience in not-for-profit management and fund raising.

Cloud Library Launches December 1st

The library's migration from Overdrive to Cloud Library has been moved up to December 1. Library users will be able to access all the e-books and e-audiobooks previously found in Overdrive. Overdrive will no longer be accessible after November 30.

Patrons can access Cloud Library on most mobile devices, including Kindle Fires. Cloud Library is not accessible on regular Kindles. Existing patron holds will be transferred to Cloud Library during the first week in December.


