

# **OverDrive is Back!** Library Brings Back OverDrive for E-books, E-audiobooks

On December 1, the library moved from OverDrive to Cloud Library as its main platform for e-books and e-audiobooks. The library staff immediately began to receive complaints by e-mail and phone from unhappy e-book and e-audiobook users. Initially, some of the issues involved logging into Cloud Library or downloading the platform's app, and were quickly resolved. However, there were also a rapidly-growing number of complaints from people with Kindle Paperwhites and MP3 players.

While e-book and e-audiobook usage grew over the past decade, the library did receive complaints about OverDrive's usability. Unfortunately, for many years there were no other legitimate alternatives for libraries. Cloud Library existed, but the variety of titles available for purchase through the platform didn't rival OverDrive--until recently.

The library re-visited Cloud Library in the fall of 2016. When the library staff tested

Cloud Library on various mobile devices, they thought that it was easier to use than OverDrive. In addition, 95% of the titles available through OverDrive could be purchased for Cloud Library; Cloud Library also had titles unavailable through OverDrive.

The library obtained statistics from OverDrive to determine which devices were most used to download e-books and e-audiobooks; however, the statistics didn't include Kindle Paperwhites and MP3s because users download e-books and e-audiobooks onto a desktop computer before transferring them to those devices. Unlike OverDrive, which has licensing agreements with Amazon, Cloud Library is not compatible with Kindle Paperwhites or MP3 players. Cloud Library can be used with any Smart phone, Kindle Fires, iPads, and any Android device.

Prior to the move to Cloud Library, the library launched another e-audiobook service, OneClickDigital. The product offers 5,000 adult and 1,500 children's e-audiobook titles, most of which can be used with MP3 players. OneClickDigital also allows simultaneous use, meaning a title can be checked out by multiple users at the same time—a feature that neither OverDrive nor Cloud Library offer. The only drawback to OneClickDigital is that there are only 50 new e-audiobook titles added to the collection each quarter. Unfortunately, the addition did not appear to satisfy the library's MP3 player users.

While the purpose of the move to Cloud Library was to improve usability, many perceived the change as a reduction of services. Others believed the move was a budget-cutting measure. In reality, the library has continued to expand its digital offerings. In addition to OneClickDigital, it launched two new products, Atomic Training and Mergent Intellect, on January 3.

When the library's statistics for December 2016 were pulled, it showed that e-book and e-audiobook usage had plummeted 50% from the previous month. While the library didn't want to divide its annual e-book and e-audiobook budget between two platforms, it ultimately decided to bring OverDrive back to accommodate Kindle and MP3 player users.

OverDrive is a "platform," which means that it doesn't automatically contain content; OverDrive is simply the access point. Over the past decade, the library purchased all the e-book and e-audiobook titles individually to fill the platform with content. When the move to Cloud Library occurred, the library moved its 3,500 e-audiobook titles and 7,200 e-book titles from OverDrive to the new platform. These titles will remain in Cloud Library; transferring electronic titles between platforms is not a simple or easy process.

The library is still under contract with Cloud Library and will continue to offer the platform, which it still considers easier to use than OverDrive for many devices. As a result, library users returning to OverDrive on February 1 will notice a far smaller selection of titles. However, the library did purchase approximately 400 new titles for OverDrive prior to the re-launch and will continue to re-build the collection each month. Several hundred additional titles which could not be transferred to Cloud Library originally due to copyright issues will also re-appear in OverDrive.







"New Libraries" Webpage Features Final Building Plans, Will Document Construction

The library's design plans for its new facilities are complete. Construction is expected to begin the third week of April. The library has created a webpage on its website that now features the site plans, floor plans, and exterior elevations for each facility. Once interior drawings are available, they will also be placed on the webpage. Once construction begins, the library will update the webpage regularly with photographs to document the progress at each location.

# **Hoopla Usage Limits Increased**

The library added Hoopla in the spring of 2015, giving patrons access to thousands of digital videos, songs, and audiobook titles for use on their computer, smartphone or tablet. The library's annual fee for usage is based on usage; there is a charge per use. Unlike the library's print collection and even other digital resources, users can access the same titles on Hoopla simultaneously without the need for placing a request. The first year the library offered Hoopla the budget for the service was \$15,000.

The library publicized Hoopla heavily over the past two years and usage steadily increased each month. Over the final six months of 2016, Hoopla usage increased to \$3,300 a month. When the library moved from OverDrive to Cloud Library in December, Hoopla usage spiked to \$4,100. The spike was likely driven by unhappy former OverDrive users seeking another place to find e-audiobooks.

Unable to afford the \$50,000 that Hoopla was on pace to cost in 2016-2017, the library decided to cap Hoopla usage at \$2,000 per month in December 2016. The monthly budget limit is broken



down by day. If the library's daily budget was already expended, users received a message that a title was unavailable and they should try again the next day. When the usage cap was set, the library's staff began to receive phone calls from upset users who were unable to check out titles.

With the library staff already handling ongoing issues and complaints about the move to Cloud Library, the administration acted quickly to address the Hoopla matter. At their January meeting, the library's Board of Trustees approved a requested amendment to the library's annual budget and increased the monthly usage cap for Hoopla to \$4,000 per month. This spring, the Library Board will reconsider the usage cap on Hoopla for the 2017-2018 fiscal year.

# Friends Memberships to Expire in March 2017-2018 Members Get First Tour of New Libraries

Friends of the Library annual memberships expire on March 31. Along with regular membership perks, such as an invitation to Friends-only book sale previews, special book sale discounts, and an invitation to special Friends-only programs, 2017-2018 Friends of the Library members will receive an exclusive, private tour of the new buildings by the library's director, Steve Campbell, prior to their opening to the public.

Membership dues are used to provide additional new materials, furniture, and equipment at the library's branches. Friends' membership dues are designated solely for a member's local branch and are tax deductible. The renewal form can be found on the last page of the library's e-newsletter. Currently, the library has 300 Friends of the Library members systemwide.

# Montgomery County Commission Fails to Place Library Measure on April 2017 Ballot

The Montgomery County Commission failed to place a measure on the April 2017 ballot which would have given voters in the southern portion of the County an opportunity to vote on receiving public library service in the area. The deadline for the measure to be placed on the ballot was January 24. Montgomery County is one of the few counties in Missouri without countywide public library service. Currently, individuals living in the County outside of Montgomery City must pay either Montgomery City Public Library or Scenic Regional Library for a non-resident library card.

A mail survey conducted by the library in the summer of 2016 indicated that slightly more than 50% of registered voters in southern Montgomery County would like to join Scenic Regional Library. Scenic Regional Director Steve Campbell had met with the Commissioners on three previous occasions in 2016 about expanding library service into the County.

In early January 2017, Campbell presented two resolutions to the Montgomery County Commissioners. The first resolution would have created three library subdistricts in Montgomery County along school district boundaries—Montgomery City school district, Wellsville school district, and Montgomery County portion of the Hermann school district.

The second resolution would have placed a tax measure on the April 2017 ballot in the southernmost library subdistrict. If the measure had passed with a simple majority, it would have joined Scenic Regional Library.

Scenic Regional Library had agreed in writing—as requested by the Commission—to pay the cost to place the measure on the ballot, estimated at \$3,600. As a result, the resolutions could have been approved by the Commission for no cost to the county. Campbell believed that the resolutions would be approved prior to the deadline.

If the ballot measure in southern Montgomery County had been placed on the ballot and approved, the library district had discussed building a new, larger facility in Hermann to serve the residents of both northern Gasconade County and southern Montgomery County. Now, those plans are on hold, at least temporarily, until the library district decides its next course of action regarding southern Montgomery County.

The creation of the three library subdistricts would have also allowed the Montgomery City Public Library and Wellsville Public Library to ask voters to expand library service into those portions of the county within the next five years, if they had wanted.

If Scenic Regional Library were to be expanded into southern Montgomery County, residents would be able to obtain a library card to use any of the system's branches, including the nearby Hermann branch. They would also enjoy access to the library's extensive digital resources, including digital music, digital videos, e-books, e-magazines, and e-audiobooks. The library would have also scheduled multiple monthly bookmobile stops in the subdistrict, in communities such as McKittrick, Big Spring, and Rhineland, and provide its free books-by-mail program for homebound residents.

Currently, the non-resident fee for a library card is \$25, but there has been discussion to increase the fee to \$60 a year. Since the library's tax increase in 2014, the average homeowner in the Scenic Regional Library pays \$60 in taxes to the library each year. There are many Montgomery County residents who currently pay to obtain a Scenic Regional Library card.
