



Sullivan Branch Friends of the Library to Form

The Sullivan Friends of the Library group plans to hold its first meeting on October 16, 2017, at 6:00 PM at the Sullivan branch. The group will elect officers for 2017-2018 and plan their activities for the year. The general public is welcome to attend the meeting. Any Friends of the Library member can serve on the governing committee, which can be up to nine members.

The Friends of the Library groups help recruit new members and book sale volunteers, publicize library services, organize fundraisers, and determine how their funds should be donated to their local branch. All membership dues and donations to the Sullivan Friends of the Library are designated solely for their group.



Library Construction Underway; Website Documents Progress

Construction is underway at the New Haven, Owensville, St. Clair, and Wright City sites. The footings and slab were poured at the New Haven site in mid-September. The footings and slab were poured at the Owensville site at the end of September.

The Owensville construction was expected to follow the same timeline as New Haven, but was slightly delayed when subcontractors encountered a concrete foundation and fill on the site while digging the footings. The foundation and fill were from the boiler room and basement of the public school which previously existed on the site. The school was built in 1952 and expanded in 1958. When the school was demolished in 2014, the boiler room and basement were filled with rebar, bricks, and concrete.

The library hopes to open both branches in late-April 2018. The Owensville branch will be 6,800 square feet; New Haven branch, 5,000 square feet.

The subcontractors also began the earthwork and digging the footings at the Wright City site in late September. Once the footings and foundations are complete in Wright City, the subcontractors will move on to the Warrenton site. Wright Construction, the library's general contractor, plans to have the footings and foundations poured at all seven locations by November 1.

Warrenton Branch Offering Passport Services

Beginning Monday, October 9, people will be able to apply for a U.S. passport at the Warrenton branch. Many public libraries around the country now offer passport services. All seven full-and parttime employees at the branch completed a training webinar in order to serve as passport agents.

A new passport for an adult costs \$110, plus a \$25 application fee. The application process normally takes about 25 minutes. Once an application is submitted, it takes approximately 4-6 weeks to receive a passport. However, there are options to receive it sooner. Passport services are by appointment only. New Haven Librarians Visit Laura Ingalls Wilder Sites and Pageant

New Haven branch staff members Wanda Walkenhorst and Pat Aichholz-Schowe traveled on a road trip to De Smet, South Dakota, and Walnut Grove, Minnesota, in late July to see *Little House on the Prairie* author Laura Ingalls Wilder's homes and historic sites.

While visiting the sites, they also attended the Little Town on the Prairie Pageant in De Smet, held the last three weekends in July. The pageant is based on *Little Town on the Prairie*, an autobiographical children's novel; it is the seventh of nine books in the Little House series. The pageant tells the De Smet story, where the Ingalls family lived the longest. The sets include the Wilders' house in town, schoolhouse, and their shanty on the prairie. This year's pageant marked Wilder's 150th birthday.

Owensville Internet Bandwidth Upgrade Complete

In mid-September, Internet bandwidth at the Owensville branch was increased from 5MB to 10MB. Fidelity performed the upgrade, which was coordinated by the Missouri Research and Education Network (MOREnet).

Patrons visit the library to update their Smartphones, download e-books, watch videos, download music, and other tasks that consume large amounts of bandwidth. As a result, the library's Internet line was reaching its maximum capacity at certain points throughout each day and slowing down. The upgrade will provide enough capacity for the branch's current Internet usage, as well as growth in the immediate future. However, the library upgrades its Internet bandwidth on a continuous basis, sometimes as often as every few years at some locations, due to growing Internet and wireless usage.

An upgrade to the Internet bandwidth at the New Haven branch will occur when the new facility opens in April or May 2018.
