Library Begins Offering Free Notary Services

Beginning
December 1, the

at all branches.
All managers and
full-time staff at the
branches are certified
notaries. In order to
have a document



notarized, an individual must present a photo ID. Documents which are commonly notarized include property deeds, wills, and powers of attorney.

Public Forum about the New Union Branch and Administrative Offices Design

The library will unveil the plans for the Union branch and administrative offices at a public forum on December 14. The facility will be built adjacent (directly north) Pasta House on Highway 47. John Mueller, owner of JEMA, the library's architectural firm, will present the interior floor plan and drawings of the exterior. The public is encouraged to attend the forum and provide feedback on the plans.

The library plans to accept bids on the project beginning February 1 and begin construction in March 2018. The new facility is expected to open in January 2019. The new library will be 17,200 square feet and administrative offices, which will include the bookmobile collection, 5,800 square feet.

Library's Staff Development Day a Big Success

All Scenic Regional Library branches were closed on November 10 for the third annual staff development day at East Central College's Training Center. The library's 72 part- and full-time employees attended the event.

The event featured nine break-out sessions and two team-building activities, including "Customers with Mental Health Needs, Strategies for Library Staff" presented by Crider Health Center; "Planning for Emergencies: Steps for Preparedness," presented by the Franklin County Emergency Management Agency; and "Situational Awareness and Safety" presented by the Franklin County Sheriff's Department. Firefighters from the Union Fire Protection District also provided fire extinguisher training for the staff.





Learn a Foreign Language with Pronunciator

Do you want to learn a foreign language as a New Years' Resolution? Are you going on a big trip overseas in 2018 and want to learn some basic phrases in the local language? The library can help! Scenic Regional offers an online foreign language



instruction database called Pronunciator that you can access for free from home on the library's website. Pronunciator is also extremely mobile-friendly; all of its features are available on iOS and Android mobile devices. You just need a valid Scenic Regional or Washington Public library card.

Pronunciator offers lessons in 80 languages, including Arabic, Mandarin Chinese, French, German, Italian, Russian, Japanese, and Spanish. The online language learning program incorporates live teacher-led instruction, learning guides, music, film, and more. Pronunciator also features "ProLive", which offers hundreds of live, weekly conversation classes led by qualified native speakers.

In addition, Pronunciator offers an English as a Second Language curriculum with courses for 50 non-English languages. Pronunciator is very "kid-friendly"; many language lessons have sections designed for learners as young as ages 3–6.

Missouri Residents May Need Passports* to Board Domestic Flights in 2018

 \mathbf{M} issouri was one of a few states which are not compliant with the federal REAL ID act. REAL ID compliance is required for a state's driver's license to be considered a valid ID when boarding an airplane. For the past 9 years, Missouri has received multiple extensions in order to provide them with additional time to comply with the federal law. However, the most recent extension expired in October. Currently, the state is operating under a grace period which expires on January 22, 2018. If the extension is not granted, Missouri residents will need a U.S. passport to board an airplane, even for domestic flights, after January 22, 2018.

Scenic Regional Library provides passport services at its Warrenton and Union branches. All staff at the two locations are trained passport agents. Passport services are by appointment

only. Please call the Warrenton branch at 636-456-3321 or Union branch at 636-583-3224 to schedule an appointment.

A new passport for an adult costs \$110, plus a \$25 application fee. The application process normally takes about 25 minutes. Once an application is submitted, it takes approximately 4-6 weeks to receive a passport. However, there are options to receive it sooner. New Construction Update

The concrete footings and slabs have been poured and steel frames erected at the Wright City, New Haven, and Owensville sites. The concrete slabs will be poured and steel frames erected at all seven locations by early December. The new branches in New Haven and Owensville are expected to be complete by the end of April 2018 and Wright City by the end of May. The other branches are expected to open between June and August of 2018.

The \$22 million building project, which includes the Union branch and new administrative offices, will double the overall square footage of the library's facilities systemwide. The new Union branch is expected to be complete in January 2019.

"Little Free Library" Installed in Owensville

Scenic Regional Library installed a "Little Free Library" at Owensville Memorial Park on November 16. It is located along the walking trail between Pavilion 1 and the brick building that houses the bathroom facilities. The "Little Free Library" is stocked with some adult and children's books which have been donated to the library.

The project was the idea of the Owensville branch's teen club, known as Activ8, as a way to benefit the community. The group, led by the Owensville branch children's programmer Cheryl Merritt, selected the design of the library. Ms. Merritt also painted a large windmill on the side of the box to represent the Gasconade County R-II School District's mascot—the Dutchmen.

The materials for the project were donated by Pioneer Truss in Owensville, except the shingles, which were donated

by an Owensville alderman, Rob Borgmann. The "Little Free Library" was built and installed by Bill Snow, Scenic Regional Library's Facilities Manager.

Many organizations and public libraries around the world have installed Little Free Libraries. The "Little Free Library" concept is a "take a book, return a book" free book exchange. They come in many shapes and sizes, but the most common version is a small wooden box of books. Anyone may take a book or bring a book to share.

The first "Little Free Library" was installed in Wisconsin in 2009. In 2012, the Little Free Library non-profit organization was established. Today, there are over 50,000 "Little Free Libraries" registered worldwide. Currently, the Owensville "Little Free Library" is not affiliated or registered with the organization.

Holocaust Author Visit in Hermann

m The Gasconade County R-I School District approached the library and other local organizations in October about assisting with the cost of scheduling author Michael Bornstein, Mr. Bornstein wrote Survivors Club: The True Story of a Young Prisoner of Auschwitz. The library contributed \$500 toward the author visit.

Mr. Bornstein spoke at the Hermann High School auditorium at 1:00 PM to students of the high school, middle school, and St. George Catholic School on November 14. Over 800 students attended the author visit. He also spoke on November 14 in the evening at St. George Catholic Church in Hermann, which was open to the public. An additional 500 people attended the evening program.

Other sponsors for the event included the Community Foundation of the Hermann Area, Hermann Arts Council, Hermann Area Jaycees, Hermann Area Chamber of Commerce, Hermann German-American Club, The Hermann Advertiser-Courier, The Stone Giraffe (bed and breakfast), and St. George School.

The library previously had a different Holocaust survivor speak at the Warrenton, Pacific, and Union branches, and the programs were also successful.






Check-out Some Self-Help Books to Achieve Your New Years' Resolutions




Proceeds from the sale of the donor wall books are designated for the local Friends of the Library group and used to assist with the purchase of furnishings and equipment in their new building.
