Staff Snapshot: Laura

Frequent visitors to the Scenic Regional Library St. Clair Branch will immediately recognize Laura. Laura is a fixture at the branch, providing personalized customer service



to its patrons for the past eight years. Whether it's finding a book, registering for a library program, or solving a technology issue, Laura is the go-to person at the branch.

Laura began working as a circulation clerk for Scenic Regional Library when her kids were in school and she needed a part-time job. "I had experience with customer service and the library seemed like it would be a great place to work," Laura said.

Helping patrons is a big part of Laura's job, but she also leads the branch's adult book club once a month. "I enjoy the book discussions that the book group has," she said.

Laura said she has seen a lot of changes at the library over the last eight years and that she's excited about the library's future, including its 4,450 square foot expansion slated to open in late summer of 2018. "One of the big changes I recall the most was when the St. Clair Branch moved from the old city hall building, which still had the jail cells in the basement of the building, to our current location, which used to be the post office at one time," Laura said. "I am looking forward to the new addition at the St. Clair Branch and what the future may hold. I really like working here with this great group of ladies."

No Spring Book Sale in 2018; Big Changes Coming

The library will not have a spring book sale in 2018. The cancellation was due to the library's ongoing construction project. The system-wide spring sale is normally held in March or April and the library expects the first of its new facilities to open in late April.

The library expects the book sale to change significantly in the fall. In the past, most branches have held their book sales at off-site locations due to space limitations. For example, the St. Clair branch has held their sale at the City Hall Gym; Pacific branch, at City Hall; and Owensville branch, at the Gasconade Historical Society Museum. Only the Warrenton and Union branches have held their sales in their meeting room. The books and other materials were mostly stored in Union at the administrative offices and brought to the branches in a U-Haul truck for the sale.

The new and expanded branches, which all open by the end of the summer 2018,

will feature meeting rooms. They will also have adjoining storage rooms for tables, chairs, and book sale materials. Future book sales will be held on-site in the new branches' meeting rooms. The new facilities will make setting up for the book sales much easier.

In addition, the local Friends of the Library groups will be given the opportunity to assume responsibility for organizing the sales. Currently, library staff deliver books; contact and schedule volunteers to work at the sales: and dispose of the leftover books after the sales (bring them to recycling or find local organizations to take the books). If a Friends groups accepts responsibility for the sale, they will perform these duties. They will also receive all proceeds from their local sale. In the past, the book sale proceeds are given directly to the library for operations. Many other libraries around the country have their Friends' groups organize their book sales as a source of revenue.

Local Bluegrass Band to Perform in Marthasville

Woodshine, a local bluegrass, rock twist band, will be featured in a free library program at Duck's Bar & Grill in Marthasville on Tuesday, February 27 at 6:30 PM. The five member band hails from Washington and has been playing together since 2012.

Woodshine features the instrumental stylings of Matthew Diener on guitar/banjo, Alex Ferguson on guitar/mandolin, Erik Ferguson on bass, Brittany Griffith on fiddle and Jordan Knight on percussion. The band's set list will include traditional bluegrass, outlaw country and some rock



Construction Update

 Γ he library's building project continues to move toward completion. The exterior windows have been installed at the New Haven and Wright City branches. The two facilities are expected to be complete by late April. Work on the Owensville branch is closely behind the two and should be opened by mid-May.

After a lengthy delay due to issues with the existing foundation, the footings were poured for the Warrenton branch expansion in late January. Study Room Opened at the Union Branch

 Γ he Union branch now has a study room ideal for small group work, tutoring, and interviews. The room is furnished with a table and four chairs. Reservations are not required to use the room, however, if there is a particular time when you want to use it, please call ahead to ensure it is available.

The space was previously the library director's office when the administration offices were housed in the Union branch. All of the library's new facilities will offer one or two study rooms when they open later this vear. The rooms will each have a table and chairs to accommodate 2-3 people.



Little Food Pantry Installed at the Union Branch

 Λ Little Food Pantry was installed at the Union branch on January 4. The library was approached by a local organizarion called Zac's Challenge in early December about placing the cabinet at the branch. The concept is that people can take whatever food they need and leave whatever food they can. The group initially stocked the small cabinet at the branch with some canned goods and other non-perishable foods.

The group has also installed and maintained other food pantries at Voss Market in Beaufort and an elementary school in St. Clair. Another unaffiliated organization has installed and maintained similar food pantries at locations in Washington, including the Washington Public Library.

Zac's Challenge <www.zacschallenge.com> is an organization aimed at raising awareness of organ and tissue donation. However, they have expanded the organization's mission to include other ways to give back to the community and continue Zac's legacy.


