# New Wright City, New Haven, and Owensville Branches Open

The library's new branches in Wright City, New Haven, and Owensville opened to the public in late May. Wright City opened on May 21; Owensville, May 23; and New Haven, May 31. The facilities experienced heavy traffic on their first day open. The Wright City branch checked out over 500 items on their first day—more than any other branch in the system. While the books, computers, new shelving, and other major components of the new facilities were in place, certain aspects were not complete. For example, some of the signage and furniture had not been installed yet. These final details will be complete by the grand openings in June.

The new facility in New Haven is 5,000 sq. ft., over triple the size of the previous facility (1,500 sq. ft.). The library had been in the previous building, a church built in the 1880's, since 1990. The new Owensville branch is 6,800 sq. ft., increase in size compared to the previous 2,500 sq. ft. storefront occupied for the past twenty-four years. The Wright City branch, library in the community, is 7,800 sq. ft.



#### Friends of the Library Tours

For the past two years, the Friends of the Library groups publicized a tour of the new branches before they opened to the public as a membership incentive. The Wright City branch tour was held on May 17; Owensville branch tour, May 21; and New Haven branch tour on May 30. Invitations were mailed to each branch's Friends members for 2016-2018. The local newspapers were also invited to the tours. Director Steve Campbell gave the tours.





#### St. Clair Branch Closed on June 4

The St. Clair Branch will be closed on Monday, June 4, due to construction. The books and other materials, public computers, and circulation desk will be temporarily moved over to the addition. The staff will operate out of the addition while the existing library is closed and renovated throughout June. The expanded and renovated St. Clair branch is expected to be completed by the end of July. The facility is being expanded from 4,500 sq. ft. to 9,100 sq. ft. On-site parking will also be doubled.

#### Library Awarded Self-Check Grant

The library was awarded a \$30,921 grant for five Bibliotheca self-check systems. The self-check systems will be installed at the Wright City, St. Clair, Warrenton, Pacific, and Sullivan branches. Space for a self-check system, along with the necessary power and data, was included in the design of each new facility.

The systems will give patrons the option to check their materials out on their own. They will also be equipped with software allowing patrons to register for programs at the kiosk, the ability to download an e-book or e-audiobook, and suggestions for "read-a-like" items available for check out.

The first self-check system was installed at the new Wright City branch on May 23. The grant was written by the library's Collection Development and ILL Manager Paul Schroeder.

The grant was awarded by the Missouri Secretary of State and Missouri State Library. The Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA), the major federal grant program for libraries, is provided through the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).



#### Branch Phone Numbers Changed

The library's branches in Owensville and New Haven were assigned new phone numbers when they moved to their new locations in May. The New Haven branch phone number will be 573-603-0466; Owensville branch, 573-371-1090.

The library has been moving from traditional phone lines to voice-over IP phones (VOIP) over the past few years. VOIP operates phones over Internet lines. The library's administrative offices and Union branch have been on VOIP for a few years. VOIP costs half as much as traditional phone lines.

The library's plan is to move each branch to VOIP when they move to their new facility. With the Union and Warrenton branches, the library was able to keep their existing phone numbers. Unfortunately, Fidelity is our carrier for the Owensville and New Haven branches and they were unwilling to port the library's existing numbers over to VOIP. As a result, these branches were assigned new phone numbers.

# Scheduled for New Haven, Wright City, and Owensville

The library has grand opening events planned for its new facilities in New Haven, Wright City, and Owensville in June. A dedication ceremony will be held at each event, which will include guest speakers and a Chamber of Commerce ribbon cutting.

The Wright City branch event will be Saturday, June 9, 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The dedication ceremony will be from 11:30 AM to noon. There will be a remote broadcast and music provided by KWRE AM 730. Mike Thomas, host of Livewire, will be at the broadcast.

m T}$  he Scenic Regional Library Board awarded Wright Construction the contract for the new Union branch and administrative offices. The winning bid was \$4.3 million. Wright Construction is located in St. Peters and also building the library's current seven new facilities.

The Union branch will be 17,200 sq. ft. and administrative offices 5,800 sq. ft. Construction on the 23,000 sq. ft. building will begin in June and expected to be completed in April 2019. The facility was designed by JEMA, located in St. Louis, who also designed the library's other seven new facilities.

# Purchase a "Book" for the Donor Wall in Your Community's New Library


The Scenic Regional Library Foundation and Friends of the Library groups are selling donor wall "books", which will be placed in the entrance hallway of each new library building.
