Grand Opening Events Held in Wright City, Owensville, & New Haven

The library held grand opening events for its new facilities in New Haven, Wright City, and Owensville in June. The events each had free children's activities, including air brush or glitter tattoos, a bounce house, and balloon artist. A dedication ceremony was held at each event, which will include guest speakers and a Chamber of Commerce ribbon cutting.

The library also gave away free hot dogs, drinks, and popcorn. The New Haven and Owensville branches' Friends of the Library members volunteered at the events.

Close to 200 people attended the Wright City branch event on June 9. Mike Thomas, host of Livewire on KWRE AM 730, did a live remote broadcast and played music. Guest speakers were Warren County Commissioner Roger Mauzy and State Representative Bryan Spencer.

The Owensville branch grand opening also drew over 200 people on June 16. The local band Alderwood performed at the event. The Owensville branch ceremony also included a flag dedication ceremony led by the local VFW post. Guest speakers were Gasconade County Commissioner Jerry Lairmore and State Representative Tom Hurst.

The New Haven branch event was held on June 23; over 150 people attended the event. Diane Jones, host of the Diane Jones Show on KLPW FM 92.7, did a live remote broadcast and played music. Guest speakers were Justin Alfermann, Legislative Director to the Governor, and Dave Hinson, Franklin County Commissioner. (Additional pictures on page 6)


Self-Check System Goes Live at Wright City Branch

The library's first self-check system went live at the Wright City branch in late June. Patrons at the branch now have the option of checking out their own materials. The system also suggests "read-a-likes" for the items they're checking out, and can even be used to download e-books and e-audiobooks. In the near future. the library will equip the system to allow patrons to register for programs at the kiosk. too.

The Sullivan branch will be the next to launch a self-check system when the new facility opens on July 23.

The library was awarded a \$30,921 grant for five Bibliotheca self-check systems. The self-check systems will be installed at the Wright City, St. Clair, Warrenton, Pacific, and Sullivan branches. Space for a self-check system, along with the necessary power and data, was included in the design of each new facility.

The grant was awarded by the Missouri Secretary of State and Missouri State Library. The Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA), the major federal grant program for libraries, is provided through the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS).



Sullivan Branch to Open in July

 Υ he library's new Sullivan branch is expected to open on Monday, July 23. The 10,000 sq. ft. building will be more than triple the size of the existing facility. In addition, more than 7,000 new items will be added to the branch's collection.

The new building's hours will be expanded to include a third week night. On Monday evenings, the branch will be open until 8:00 PM.

Accounts created online can only be used to access e-books, e-audiobooks, and other electronic and reference resources. To upgrade the account so that it can be used to check out materials at a library branch, the library card and photo identification need to be brought into a branch library.



New Haven and Owensville Friends of Library Groups Hold Fundraisers

The New Haven and Owensville branches Friends of Library groups both held highly-successful fundraiser events at the new facilities in June.

At both events, individuals and businesses bid for the naming rights to different areas in the library for one year. The winning bidder could have their name, their business name, or a loved one's name, along with a photograph or logo, placed on a 22" x 28" framed color sign in the section of the library.

The New Haven Friends of the Library event, called Rock the Books Silent Auction Fundraiser, was held on June 7 and raised over \$3,000. All the food and alcohol were provided by sponsors—
Thrivent, Pinckney Bend Distillery and individual Friends members. Bill Krone and the Bluegills was also a sponsor; they performed live bluegrass music throughout

the event.

The Owensville Friends of the Library event, called the Love of the Library Auction, was a live auction; the auctioneer was Gross Auction. The fundraiser was held on June 14 and raised \$5.225.

All the food and alcohol, as well as the auctioneering services, were provided by local businesses. Live music was performed by Dejun King. The sponsors were Walmart, White Mule Winery, Save-A-Lot, Al's Sports & Liquor, Gross Auction, Wenwood Winery, Domino's Pizza, and Swiss Meats.

All bids were tax deductible as the Scenic Regional Library Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. The proceeds from each event are designated solely for the local Friends group. The next auction fundraiser event will be at the new Sullivan branch in August.

St. Clair Branch Relocated to Addition

m The}$ St. Clair branch was closed June 13-22 due to the construction project. The shelving, materials, and computers were moved from the existing library to the new addition, where the library will operate until mid-August. The existing library will be closed during that period for renovations. The temporary area has all of the branch's books and other materials, as well as six public computers.

The 4,500 sq. ft. addition will increase the size of the branch to more than 9,100 sq. ft., which will include a 1,000 sq. ft. room for meetings and programming. New shelving, flooring, and furniture will be installed in the branch prior to the entire building being opened to the public in August.

STEM Grant Awarded

Scenic Regional Library was awarded a \$10,000 grant to purchase STEM equipment in May. STEM stands for science, technology, engineering and mathematics. Schools and libraries have been implementing STEM programs since the early 2000's to encourage kids to consider going into STEM related careers. According to the National STEM Foundation, there is currently an estimated need for 8.65 million workers in STEMrelated jobs and the advanced/high-tech manufacturing sector is facing a shortage of skilled employees of nearly 600,000. The library surveyed the public schools in Franklin, Gasconade and Warren counties and found that most of the schools did not have the equipment to offer hands-on experience to their students with high-tech technology and engineering.

With the grant funds, the library has purchased kits of Sphero robots, Ozobots, Cubelets, Code-a-pillars, Code & Go Mouse, Dash & Dot robots and the iPads necessary to use these robots. We also purchased a Rigamajig set, which is basically a giant erector set, for a nontechnology engineering option. These high-tech "toys" give kids the opportunity to "play" with technology and will hopefully spark an interest in some to pursue a STEM career. Many of these kits can be



used with very young students, but still have appeal to older students. Mobile Science Lab programs have already been held at Scenic Regional Library branches in Pacific, Union, Sullivan and St. Clair. Future programs include: Hermann branch on Friday, July 6 at 11am; New Haven branch on Thursday, July 12 at 1pm; and the Bookmobile in Marthasville on Tuesday, July 31 at 6:30pm.

We will be scheduling programs with participating schools in Franklin, Gasconade and Warren counties this Fall. The STEM Playground program will involve bringing all of the kits to a school for an entire day, setting up in a central location, and having individual classes come to let the students "play" and get hands-on experience with the technology. This project is supported by the Institute of Museum and Library Services under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act as administered by the Missouri State Library, a division of the Office of the Secretary of State.
