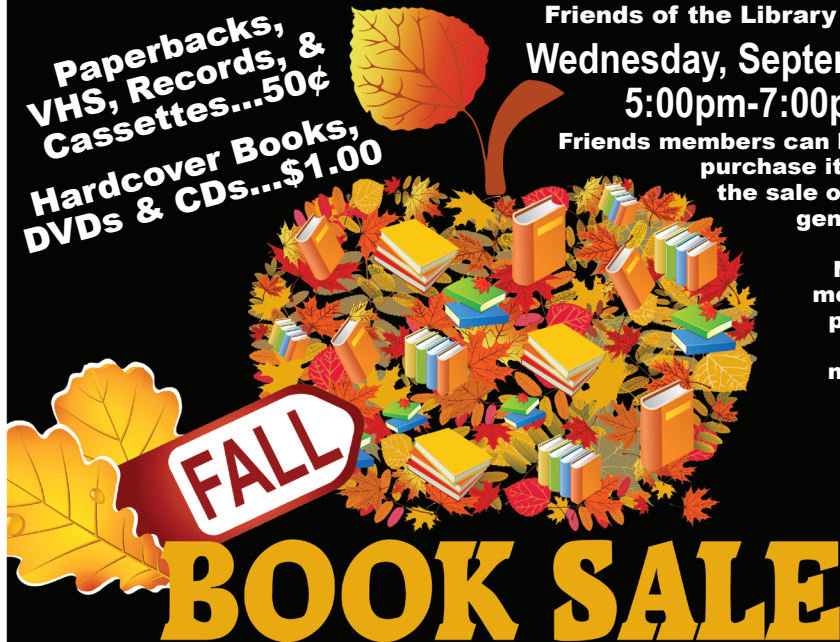

New Pacific Branch Opening Delayed & St. Clair Branch to Open in Late August

The opening of the new Pacific branch was originally scheduled for Monday, August 20. However, due to rain, the general contractor was unable to lay the asphalt parking lot on schedule. The branch opening has been delayed indefinitely.

The St. Clair branch is still scheduled to open on Friday, August 31. Some additional changes to the exterior will occur in September, while the branch is open.

St. Clair Branch Grand Opening September 22

A grand opening event for the new library is scheduled for Saturday, September 22, from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The event will have music, along with free hot dogs, chips, drinks, and popcorn. There will also be free children's activities, including air brush tattoos, a bounce house, and a balloon artist.

A short dedication ceremony will take place at the grand opening event, which will conclude with a ribbon cutting with the St. Clair Area Chamber of Commerce. Guest speakers will be Franklin County Commissioner Dave Hinson, State Representative Nate Tate, and Scenic Regional Library Trustee John Cheatham.

A grand opening event for the new library is scheduled for Saturday, September 29, from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The event will have music, along with free hot dogs, chips, drinks, and popcorn. A short dedication ceremony will take place at the grand opening event, which will conclude with a ribbon cutting with the Pacific Chamber of Commerce.

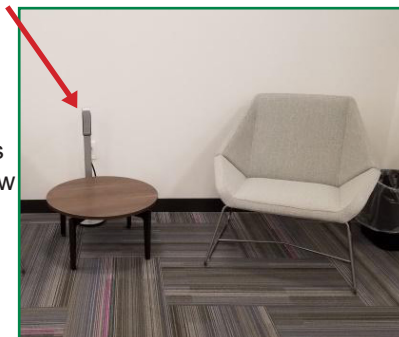

“Charging Towers” Installed at New Branches

In late July and early August the library installed charging towers at the Wright City, New Haven, and Owensville branches. The devices will be installed at all the other new facilities over the next month or two. While the library placed power outlets beneath or behind all the tables and chairs in the new facilities, they're not easy to access. The charging towers make it easier for patrons to charge their laptops, tablets, and phones, by providing outlets on a 30" or 37" stand. Each branch will have about a dozen charging towers.

Free Online Tutoring Available to Students, Grades K-12

The cost of each new school year can quickly drain your wallet. Thankfully, the library can help you save some money while also helping your kids save themselves from extra stress. Private tutoring and tutoring centers are expensive, but for many students, the one-to-one attention a tutor provides can make a huge difference in their school performance and their confidence. Give your child a leg up without spending an arm and a leg by introducing them to Tutor.com through Scenic Regional Library.

Tutor.com provides on-demand, one-to-one tutoring in an online classroom for students in kindergarten through college in over 60 academic subjects and test preparation areas, including the ACT and SAT. The Tutor.com Learning Suite also includes practice quizzes, skills drills, video lessons and The Princeton Review Essentials test preparation.

Tutors are available online every day from 2:00 PM to midnight. Certified online tutors will help your student work through math problems, edit their papers, and navigate many other academic challenges without having to leave home. To access the service, students should visit www.scenicregional.org, and then click on Homework Help under the Kids or Teens tab. If accessing the service outside of the library, a library card will be required.

What are you currently reading or what are you reading next?

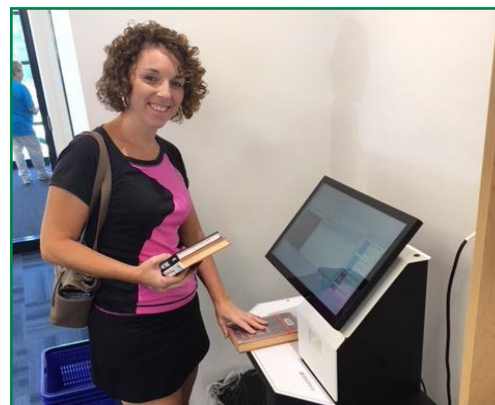

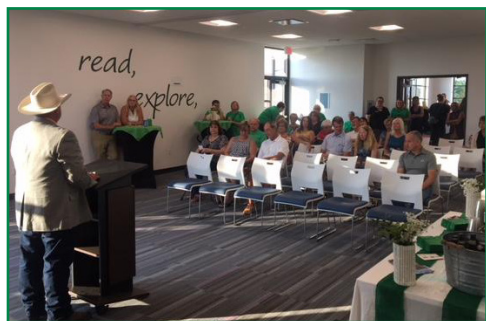

Sullivan Friends' Auction Event a Big Success

The Sullivan branch Friends of the Library group held a highly successful fundraiser event at the new facility on Thursday, August 2. Individuals and businesses bid for the naming rights to different areas in the library for one year. The winning bidder could have their name, their business name, or a loved one's name, along with a photograph or logo, placed on a 22" x 28" framed color sign in the section of the library.

All the food and alcohol, as well as the auctioneering services, were provided by local businesses. Live music was performed by Kay Harrison and Susan Eye. Auctioneer services were provided by Robbie Berti, with Berti Auction Services. Other sponsors were Belmont Winery, Clark Street Café & Bakery, First Presbyterian Church, Frick's

Market, Krueger Vending, MFA Farmers' Cooperative Association, Office Max, Our Story Coffee House, Schlafly Bottleworks, Sweet Treats Froyo & Dessert Bar, and Walmart.

The event rose over \$4,600 for the Sullivan Friends of the Library. All bids were tax deductible as the Scenic Regional Library Foundation is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization. The proceeds from each event are designated solely for the Sullivan branch Friends of the Library group.

Sullivan Grand Opening

The grand opening for the new Sullivan branch was held on Saturday, August 11. Over 350 people attended the event. The Sullivan branch Friends of the Library volunteered to distribute free hot dogs, drinks, and popcorn. There were also free children's activities, including air brush tattoos, children's carnival games, a bounce house, and a balloon artist. Musician Steve Woolley performed.

A short dedication ceremony included speeches by the Missouri State Librarian Robin Westphal; Franklin County Presiding Commissioner Tim Brinker; Scenic Regional Library Trustee Leonard Butts; and Scenic Regional Library Director Steve Campbell. The ceremony concluded with a ribbon cutting with the Sullivan Area Chamber of Commerce.

Additional New Items Added to Sullivan Branch

The library has purchased an additional 3,000 new items to fill the new Sullivan branch. The items include a wide range of formats—adult and children's books, music CD's, books on CD, and DVDs.

The Sullivan branch increased from 3,000 square feet to 10,000 square feet. When the branch opened in July, the library added 7,000 new items to the existing collection. However, once the items were shelved, it was immediately obvious that even more additional materials were needed for the facility. Due to the additional items, the branch's collection will have almost doubled since moving to the new facility.



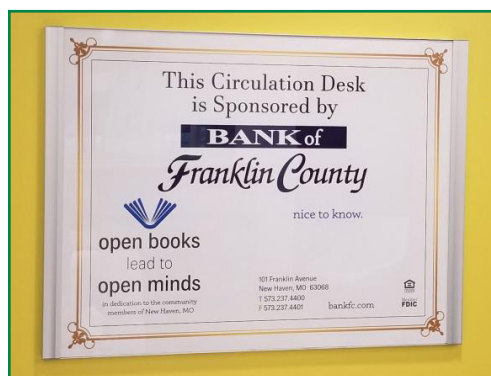

Sponsorship Signage Installed

The sponsorship signage for the Friends of the Library auction events at the New Haven and Owensville Branches has been installed. The 22" x 28" signs will remain in the branches for a year. The events, which were held in June, raised \$3,000 and \$5,500 for the branches, respectively. Individuals, businesses, and organizations bid for the naming rights for eight or nine different sections of each branch. The New Haven branch event was a silent auction; Owensville branch, a live auction. The Friends' groups have not yet determined whether or not the auctions will be annual fundraiser events.
