

New St. Clair and Pacific Branches Open

The library's St. Clair branch opened on August 29. The existing facility was expanded from 4,500 sq. ft. to 9,100 sq. ft. and completely renovated. The amount of onsite parking was almost doubled from 20 to 38 spaces. The library moved to the building at 515 E. Springfield, which was previously a post office, in 2011.

The new Pacific branch on Lamar Parkway opened on September 20 after a month-long delay due to issues with the parking lot. The facility is 10,000 sq. ft. and has a parking lot with 45 spaces. The previous branch was 4,500 sq. ft. and located downtown.

The new buildings include public meeting rooms, cafés, shaded patios, fireplaces, self-check systems, teen areas with an Xbox One for gaming, and children's areas with a 55" touch screen tablet with literacy games, a magnet wall, Lego® table, and other activities.



In September, Scenic Regional Library provided the volunteer library with five new desktop computers. Microsoft Office is also installed on each computer. Scenic Regional Library also provides the volunteer library with access to the genealogy database Ancestry.com for no cost on its computers, as well as courier service one day each week. Courier service allows Gerald patrons to pick up requests from Scenic Regional at the volunteer library.

St. Clair Friends of the Library Auction a Big Success

 T he St. Clair Friends of the Library group held a fundraiser event on September 6 to auction off naming rights (for one year) to different parts of the new library. Musicians Spike and Janice Huff performed at the event and Scott Hargraves, owner of Scott's Sales and Services, provided the auctioneer services. Other sponsors of the event were Country Mart, Dollar Plus, FastLane, Farmers and Merchants Bank, Old Farm Winery, Save A Lot, St. Clair Package Liquor, St. Jordan Creek Winery, and Schlafly Bottleworks.

The event had 17 bidders, with all ten areas raising a total of \$5,450. The highest bid was for the service desk, which was auctioned for \$1,575. The St. Clair Friends event raised the second-most money of all the auctions—only \$50 behind Owensville. The Friends also did a 50/50 raffle which raised an additional \$25. All proceeds from the auction will go to St. Clair branch.

The library's Friends groups have had auctions at four branches this year and raised a total of \$18,500. The next auction event will be at the Pacific branch in October.

Warrenton Branch to Re-open October 4; Grand Opening, October 22

 Γ he Warrenton branch will re-open on Thursday, October 4. The branch was originally slated to open on October 1. The branch has been closed since August 1 due to construction.

The facility will be the library's seventh to open over the past five months.

A grand opening event for the new Warrenton branch will be held on Saturday, October 20, from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The event will have free hot dogs, chips, drinks, and popcorn. Mike Thomas, host of Livewire on KTUI, will broadcast live from the event, as well as provide music. There will also be free children's activities, including air brush tattoos, a bounce house, and a balloon

A short dedication ceremony will take place at 11:30 AM during the grand opening event, which will conclude with a ribbon cutting with the Warrenton Chamber of Commerce. Guest speakers at the dedication ceremony will include Scenic Regional Library Board of Trustees President John Barry.

The existing Warrenton branch was

expanded from 9,000 sq. ft. to 12,000 sq. ft. and completely renovated. The amount of onsite parking was doubled from 40 to 80 spaces. The new facility includes a public meeting room, a shaded patio, fireplace, self-check system, teen area with an Xbox One for gaming, and children's area with a 55" touch screen tablet with literacy games, a magnet wall, Lego table, and other activities. The original building was constructed in 2001.




