#### Most New Branches Get Big Internet Upgrades

The library's new facilities have resulted in more traffic and more Internet usage, both through the desktop public computers and wireless network. In autumn, MOREnet\* approached the library and recommended Internet upgrades at five of the seven new branches.

In late November, the Warrenton, Wright City, St. Clair, and Sullivan branches were upgraded to 50MB Internet lines. The Owensville branch's line will be upgraded from 10 to 30 MB later this winter.

\*MOREnet is a non-profit consortium through which the library receives Internet access.


Scenic Regional Library branches will be closed January 1 in observance of The New Year!

#### New Haven and Gerald Historic Newspapers to be Digitized

Over the past five years, Scenic Regional Library has digitized almost 300,000 pages of local historical newspapers on microfilm through a partnership with the State Historical Society of Missouri. The cost of digitization was covered entirely by grants through the Missouri State Library. Digitizing the newspapers allows people to search the entire collection with a simple keyword search. The collection is free to search; searching doesn't even require a library card.

The library had planned to apply for a fourth newspaper digitization grant in January 2019. However, the State Historical Society of Missouri has agreed to digitize the newspapers with remaining



Once the Gerald and New Haven newspapers are complete (end of April 2019), all the existing historical newspapers prior to 1965 in the library's three counties will have been digitized.

According to The State Historical Society of Missouri, the library's current collection is heavily used by both local researchers, as well as those around the country. Google statistics show that in the past year the 13 online newspapers from Franklin County have been visited over 200,000 times. In the same time the five papers from Gasconade County have had over 101,000 visits and the four papers from Warren County almost 60,000 visits.

The display was delivered to the branch in early December. The display is 2' by 2' by 4-1/2' and cost approximately \$1,000, including shipping.

# Purchase a "Book" for the Donor Wall in Your Community's New Library


The Scenic Regional Library Foundation and Friends of the Library groups are selling donor wall "books", which will be placed in the entrance hallway of each new library building.
