#### Warren County R-III School District

Three people are competing for two seats on the R-III Board of Education this April.

Current officeholders Ginger Schenck and Allan Dreyer are running again for the board. They are joined by Joe Lanigan, who currently is a paraprofessional with the school district.

### **Warrenton Fire Protection District**
