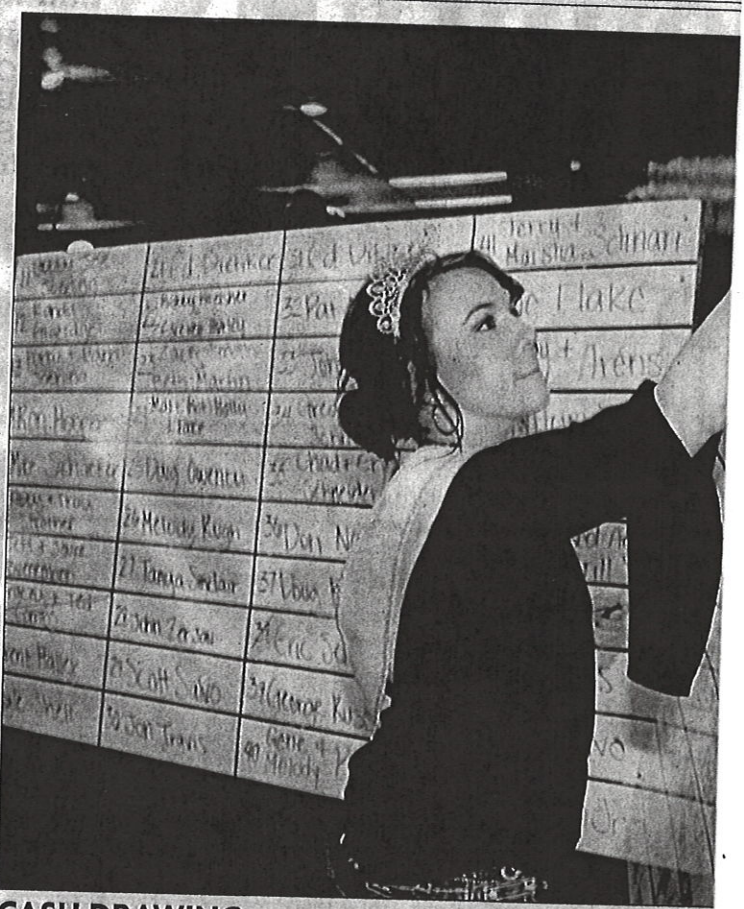

of general obligation bonds, will be paid off over 10 years by a property tax increase the district estimates will be up to 28 cents per \$100 assessed property valuation. Station No. 1 is about 50 years old, doesn't meet the volunteer fire department's space requirements and has

some costs associated with its age, district officials said. A new station would have more, larger bays for trucks and interior space for training and other daily use. The district also plans to replace breathing air apparatuses that are reaching the end of their usable life, and to outfit every fire truck with updated equipment for rescuing people trapped in wrecked vehicles.
