



HERMANN BUILDING PROJECT



In June, the library completed a five-year, \$24 million building project with the opening of its new branch in Hermann. The project doubled the library's square footage of public service space system-wide.

The new branch features a 1,000-square-foot public meeting room; two public study rooms; two shaded patios; a fireplace; a café; a self-check system; a teen area with an Xbox One for gaming; a children's area with various activities, and a 2,000-square-foot community art gallery.



CIRCULATION




Total Physical Item Circulation: 454,009






 Friends of the Library groups donated \$15,670 for the purchase of musical instruments for the children's patios at four branches. There are now 12 instruments system-wide.




