Owensville's device was donated by the Owensville Lion's Club.

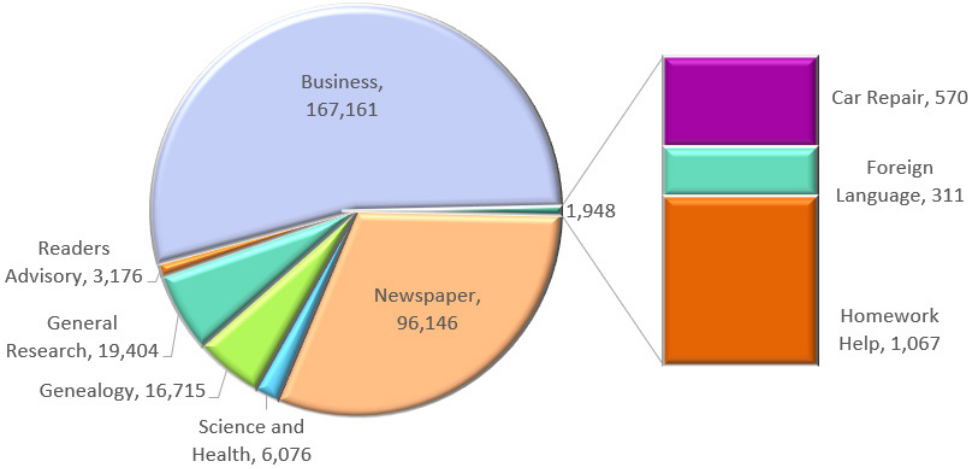
Pacific's device was donated by the Pacific Eagle's Club.

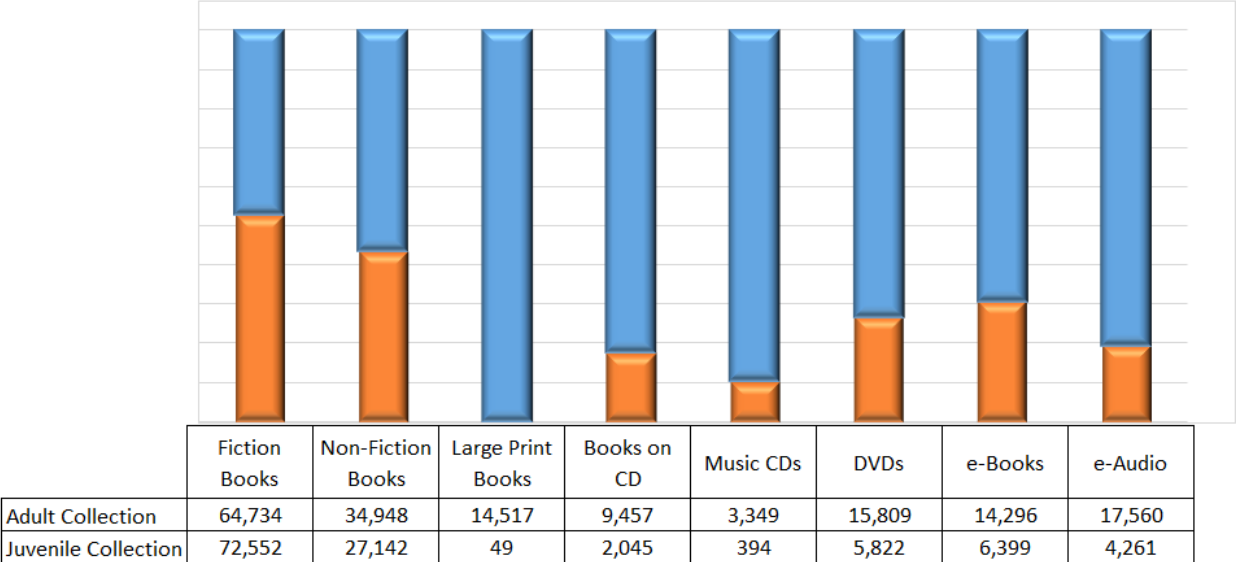

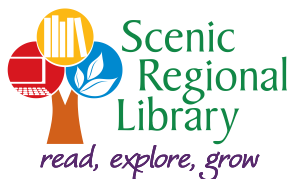

We took 1,902 passport applications.

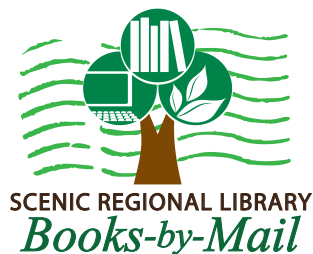

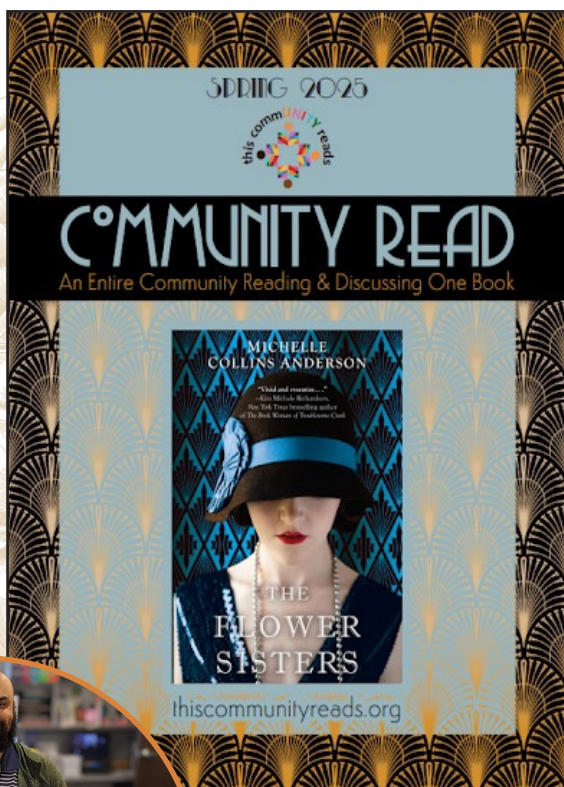
