


Library Board Approves Design for Hermann Branch

The Scenic Regional Library Board of Trustees approved the final plans for the new Hermann branch at their March 16 meeting. The design was presented by Ken Scheer with Horn Architects in Washington.

The new facility will feature a 1,000 square foot public meeting room; two exterior patios; a children's play area; two small study rooms; a 1,000 square foot community art gallery; fireplace; and other amenities. The library plans to begin construction in the fall and open the new branch by late May 2022.

The library purchased the 25,000 square foot facility at 123 Bavarian Hills Plaza, which was formerly the Alco department store, in December 2018. Approximately 11,000 square feet of the building will be renovated, which will include systemwide storage and the art gallery. The library's plans include a complete overhaul of the existing building's exterior and resurfacing of the 100-space parking lot. The library will seek tenants for the building's remaining 14,000 square feet. The total estimated cost of the project will be \$2 million.

The Hermann branch is the last component of the library's five-year, \$23 million systemwide building project. Once complete, the library will have doubled the square footage of its nine facilities, adding public meeting rooms, study rooms, and outdoor spaces at every location.




New Warrenton Branch Manager

Franklin County Administering COVID Vaccines at Old Union Branch


In early March, the Franklin County Commission approved a memorandum of understanding with Scenic Regional Library which will allow the Franklin County Health Department to use any of the library's six facilities in the county as COVID vaccination sites.

The Department has already utilized the agreement to provide vaccinations at the library's vacant former Union branch building (308 Hawthorne Drive). The building is twice the size of the Health Department's current facility and allows the Health Department to administer 300 vaccines a day. When the vaccines were being given at the Health Department, there was only space to administer 80 vaccinations per day. Beginning March 22, the Health Department began scheduling three vaccination events at the site each week.

The County is paying the library \$500 per month (using CARES Funds) for use of the facility, mainly to cover the cost of utilities. The old library building has been for sale since the new facility opened in September 2019.


Local Legislators Read Stories on Library's YouTube Channel

In the past, the library would invite local state legislators to read to children at storytime each year. This year, due to COVID restrictions, the library's storytimes have been only offered virtually. As a result, the library invited its local state legislators to record and submit a video of them reading a children's picture book of their choice.

The first legislator to submit a video was Missouri State Senator Jeanie Riddle (10th District), who read the picture book "The Little Green Turtle." Missouri State Representative Bruce Sassmann (District 62) also provided a video; he read the picture book "House Mouse, Senate Mouse," by Peter W. Barnes. As other local legislators submit their videos in the coming weeks, they will also be posted on the channel.




Missouri State Senator Jeanie Riddle reading "The Little Green Turtle."

Library Offers Intro Video Classes for Word, Excel, and PowerPoint



Patrons interested in expanding their computer skills can now do so on the library's YouTube channel at <u>www.youtube.</u> <u>com/scenicregionallibrary</u>. The library has posted three video courses: Microsoft Excel 2019: A Tour, Microsoft Word 2019: A Tour, and Microsoft PowerPoint 2019: A Tour.

Each video is approximately 20 minutes in length and gives an introduction on how the individual software is organized, with particular focus on the ribbon. A special playlist, called "Computer Classes" has been created on the library's YouTube channel in order to make it easier to find the videos.

The classes are all presented by Stacy Emerson, the library's trainer. More classes will be added to the channel as they become available. Future courses will go into more depth on each particular Microsoft software, such as manipulating data in Excel.




