# St. Clair Branch Starts Seed Library

he St. Clair branch of Scenic Regional Library is now offering a seed library. The seed library is next to the holds shelf and the self-check machine, and is available to all patrons

with a library card in good-standing. When using the seed library, patrons must fill out a log sheet to mark what

seeds they took. Coin envelopes



are available to transport the borrowed seeds. Many seed options are available, including squash/melon, beans, peppers, tomatoes, carrots, lettuce, herbs, flowers, and more. Baker Creek Heirloom Seeds donated most of the seeds.

The library will also accept any donated seeds. Donated seeds must be appropriately labeled and identified. Seed libraries are also available at the Hermann, Owensville, and Sullivan branches.

# **Grave Cleaning Clubs Beginning in May**

Beginning in May and lasting through October, the library will offer grave cleaning clubs in each county. Each month, each county's club will meet at a local cemetery and clean gravestones. The library will provide all supplies, and a library staff member will demonstrate the process.

Grave cleaning has grown in popularity over the past few years and has even become a trend on social media. Public libraries and other organizations across the country have started their own clubs.

Over time, gravestones can become covered with dirt, bird deposits, sap, and biological growth such as algae, moss, and lichen. If left unmaintained, these additions can cause a gravestone to deteriorate. In addition, lettering can become worn to the point where it's no longer readable. Cleaning gravestones helps beautify the cemetery and preserve the grave markers.

The library will utilize an environmentally friendly biological chemical called D/2 and non-metal tools to clean gravestones in the gentlest manner possible to avoid damage. The Department of Veterans Affairs and the National Park Service have tested and used these methods. D/2 is a biodegradable cleaner that is pH neutral and contains no salts, bleach, or acids.

# creativebug

that allows on-demand access to over 1,000 high-definition arts and crafts instructional videos for kids, teens, and adults.

Subjects include drawing, painting, sewing, knitting, crochet, guilting, baking, and more. All classes are taught by experts, with new classes added daily.

Creativebug video tutorials are broken down into small video segments that guide a user through the process step-by-step. Each class also includes a detailed list of needed materials and a place to take notes as you go. Creativebug provides access to thousands of classes and downloadable patterns, templates, and recipes, and it even allows users to communicate with instructors and each other. Creativebug has a mobile app available for iOS and Android.




# Last Month's Most Popular Books

# FCLC Scrabble Tournament Fundraiser

 $\Gamma$ he Franklin County Literacy Council will host a Scrabble Tournament Fundraiser on Saturday, May 4, at 6 p.m. to help provide HiSET scholarships for those in local communities. The tournament will take place at the Union Community Center, 1329 Union Ave. Doors will open at 5 p.m.

Each team can consist of up to four players. The cost to participate is \$25 per player. The tournament will also feature a 50-50 raffle and prizes. The event is BYOB and snacks.

The funds raised from the tournament will go to the Adult Education and Literacy program (AEL) at East Central College (ECC) to fund background checks and scholarships for students to take the HiSET exam.

The AEL program is accessible to everyone, and ECC has several class locations to serve students with free morning and evening classes. The program offers high school equivalency preparation and English language classes, which include basic computer training, literacy tutoring, and life-skills instruction. 
