

Chromebooks and Hotspots Now Available

Over 300 Chromebooks with built-in Wi-Fi and 100 Wi-Fi hotspots are now available at all library locations for a six-month checkout period. The devices, which have unlimited data, are also available to Washington Public Library patrons.

To check out a device, individuals must be over the age of 18. Only one device is available per household, but up to 15 devices can be connected to a Wi-Fi hotspot at the same time. If interested in checking out one of the new devices, patrons should visit or contact their local branch.

The devices were made available to the library through a \$246,498 Federal Emergency Connectivity Fund Grant, awarded October 12. The grant also covers the devices' monthly Wi-Fi fees.

John Cheatham Celebrates 35th Library Board Anniversary

John Cheatham was recognized for his 35th anniversary of serving on the Library Board of Directors during its October meeting. He was officially introduced as a new member of the Board



and elected treasurer for Franklin County on October 21, 1986. Mr. Cheatham is the longest-serving trustee in the library's 62-year history and served as Board president on multiple occasions.

Mr. Cheatham is a resident of St. Clair and retired as Assistant Superintendent of the St. Clair School District in 1999. Throughout his time on the Library Board, Mr. Cheatham has overseen enormous improvements, including construction of new branches in Union in 1991 and Warrenton in 2001; opening of a new facility in St. Clair in 2011; the library's first-ever tax increase in 2014; the Sullivan Library joining Scenic Regional in 2015; the library being named the Missouri Library Association's Library of the Year in 2017; and the systemwide construction project from 2015-2021, which re-built or expanded and renovated all 9 of the library's branches.



Hilbert Joins Library Foundation Board

Angie Hilbert, a resident of Marthasville, was appointed to the Library Foundation Board at November's Library Board meeting. Ms. Hilbert has lived in Warren County for 50 years and Marthasville for the past 15 years. She is a retired school teacher, having worked for the Warrenton R-III School District for 30 years, where she taught special education and was later a guidance counselor.



An involved community member, Ms. Hilbert is a chaplain for the Thomas Kennedy Chapter of the Daughter of the American Revolution. She is also involved with the Warren Historical Society, the Rusche Park Board in Marthasville, and serves as an elder at the New Life Church in Washington.

Staff Development Successful

All Scenic Regional Library locations were closed Thursday, November 11, for the library's annual staff development day. The event, held at the Union branch, utilized the library's multiple meeting rooms and children's area throughout the day for staff to attend multiple breakout sessions. The sessions covered a wide array of topics, including servicing patrons with disabilities, overdose education, self-defense, mindfulness and resilience, yoga, serving patrons from diverse backgrounds, mandatory child reporting, and multiple readers' advisory sessions.

Staff Spotlight: Amanda Graphic Designer, Administration



How long have you worked for Scenic? I have been working at Scenic for almost 7 years.

How did you get into the graphic design field? I deeply love creating art and when I was young I knew I wanted a career in art of some fashion. Art was always my favorite subject and I would take every class I possibly could that involved it in some capacity—which led me to join Yearbook Club in high school. I loved doing the layout design of all of the pages and thought it may be fun to do that for a living. In college, one of my professors told me he could tell I would be a good graphic designer so I took his advice and received a BFA with a graphic design emphasis. I have been working in this field for about 17 years.

Do you have a favorite style of art? By far, my favorite art movement is Impressionism; particularly work by Van Gogh, Renoir, and Monet. I love their depiction of light, the movement in their art, and their use of vibrant, pure color. I-LOVE-COLOR! I would love to walk around in one of their paintings—and had the opportunity to do so when I recently went to the Beyond Van Gogh exhibit in St. Louis. I try to use a lot of color in whatever I am creating. If I am creating fine art I like to work in mixed media.

Where do you get your ideas for your original designs, such as library employees' Summer Reading Program and Halloween t-shirts? I try to take into consideration who will be wearing/using the materials I am creating and that guides me in most instances. Graphic Designers are also inspired by other artists' work, so I like to look online and see other ideas people have used and see if I can spin something that I find fun and interesting. We usually come up with a fun slogan for the shirts and I will get ideas from that, too. Sometimes ideas just come to me and when that happens that is particularly exciting!

What is your favorite project you've worked on for the library and why? My favorite project I have worked on was the 2021 Summer Reading Program shirts for the staff. My parameters were to use the Scenic tree logo and the theme was "Tails & Tales." I had just visited Disney World with my family and was in awe of the Tree of Life I saw one evening at Disney's Animal Kingdom. So, I thought maybe I could create Scenic's own Tree of Life? It was a lot of fun hiding animals in our logo to create this fun shirt for the staff to wear. It is one of my favorite things I have ever created because what I envisioned was the final result.

What do you wish more people knew about the library? We have awesome microscopes and a vast slide collection available to check out. I have done so with my children and they spent several hours using it and we had a lot of fun!

You can only take one book to a desert island. What book, and why? I would take my favorite book: *The Great Gatsby* by F. Scott Fitzgerald. I love the symbolism, the character development, and the time period it was written in.

Is there anything else you would like people to know about you or your job? Sure! I enjoy bike riding on the Katy Trail, I'm a self-proclaimed Trekkie, Beatles fan, and I LOVE musical theater. I look forward to spending time at the Muny every summer watching the fabulous shows with my twin sister! It's one of my favorite things to do.

Winter Reading Program Returns



Mark your calendars! Scenic Regional Library will be hosting its second annual Winter Reading BINGO Program for all ages, beginning January 3 - February 28. Bring your completed BINGO card to your local branch and get a free book for every BINGO, up to a maximum of 5 books. Cards will be available at branches or can be downloaded on the library's website. Participants will also be able to log their reading in READsquared.

Library Offers Book Connections

Book Connections, a new digital service offered by Scenic Regional Library, features an array of original and curated resources from across the internet, regarding books, in one place. The



collection of digital supplements' goal is to enrich the reading experience of thousands of children's and young adult books.

The service provides a child or teen access to several compiled resources regarding the book they are reading. These resources include author profiles, blogs, multiple author interviews, book guides, activities, lessons, book trailers, vocab lists, and more.

In addition to individual book resources, Book Connections also offers many other helpful functions, such as the ability to search like titles and authors to one's favorite books, over 15,000 read-along audiobook performances, over 1,800 complete book readings, support assignments, author studies, and personal recordings from authors pronouncing and explaining their names.

The service also offers a multitude of resources directed toward parents and educators. These resources include the ability to browse all books and author resources, identifying books for young readers, how-to guides on infusing diverse books into reading, customizable book lists and collection analysis, and book promotion materials such as printable QR Codes.

Book Connections launched on the Scenic Regional Library website in October and is provided by the Missouri State Library, using American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) funds. For more information, visit www.scenicregional.org/kids.




"The Battle For Sevastopol" Available on Hoopla

I want to start by saying that I hate war movies; so I don't know why my husband and I watched this one. But it is one of the best movies I've ever seen. It's about a young girl, Lyudmila Pavlichenko, who becomes a soviet sniper in WW2. Not only is she a sniper, she is far and away the best sniper, with the highest kill count, in the war. After an injury, she travels on a government mission to the US where she meets and is mentored by Eleanor Roosevelt. The movie is difficult and gritty but afterward my husband and I both agreed that it was a

movie we will never forget. It's the type of movie that not only makes you think, it makes you feel.

"Split Second" by David Baldacci

A great writer develops storylines and characters which are believable and relatable. The writer is able to captivate and draw the reader into the story early in the book. David Baldacci is a great mystery writer and he quickly ensnares his readers in the book Split Second.

Michelle Maxwell is a Secret Service agent in charge of protecting a presidential candidate. When Michelle lets him out of her sight for a brief moment, he vanishes. Who's involved with the disappearance and why?

Eight years earlier Sean King was acting as a lead Secret Service agent when, for a split second, he was distracted and the candidate he was protecting was shot and killed. Were these two incidents coincidence or has someone orchestrated King and Maxwell's downfall?

From beginning to end Split Second is a roller coaster of twists and turns as King and Maxwell try to uncover the motive of an unknown killer and, at the same time, clear their reputations. The reader is drawn to Baldacci's characters and we feel their frustration and helplessness. We also see their courage and strength as a team. This is the first book in a great series which is pure Baldacci
