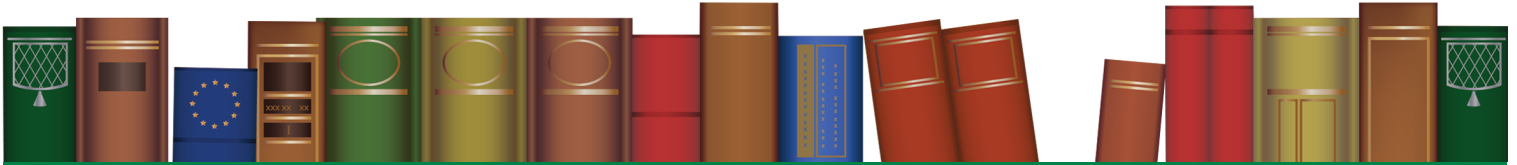

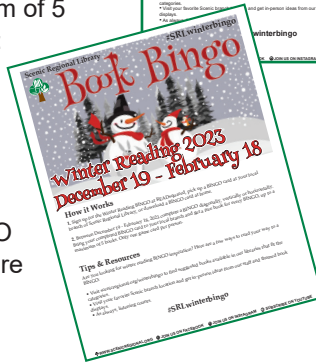
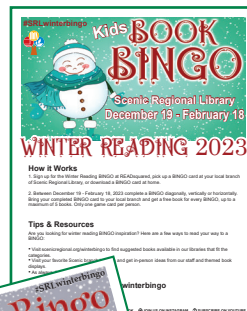
Winter BINGO Program Returns



Scenic Regional Library's Winter Reading BINGO Program will return this year on December 19, lasting through February 18. All ages are encouraged to participate. To participate in the program, pick up a BINGO card at your local branch or register online.

After completing a BINGO on your BINGO card diagonally, vertically, or horizontally, bring your completed card to the library and get a free book for every BINGO, up to a maximum of 5 books. Examples of BINGO space challenges include: reading a book with a blue cover, reading the same book as someone else, using the self-check machine, enjoying a family movie night, reading a book to a pet or stuffed animal, and much more. Tasks differ between age groups. The Winter Reading Program ends on February 18, so be sure to turn in your BINGO card or complete all of your activities online on or before the deadline. Patrons can also log their reading on READsquared, an online reading tracking system.

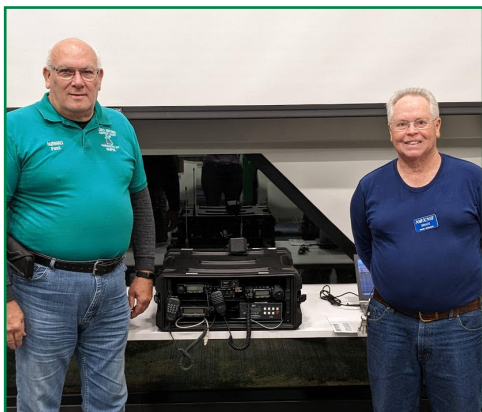

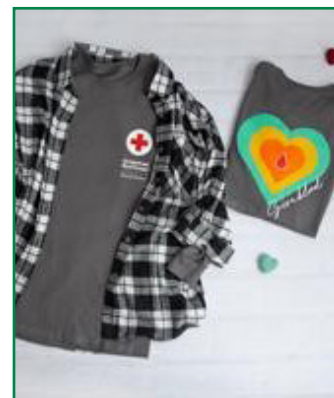

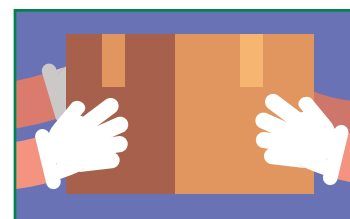
Meeting Room Policy Change

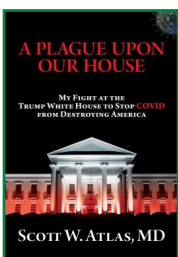
Staff Picks

"A Plague Upon Our House" by Scott W. Atlas, MD

Throughout 2020, I watched the White House Press Briefings on the Coronavirus every day. As the recommendations from the COVID-19 Task Force were communicated by Drs. Birx, Fauci, and Redfield, Vice-President Pence, as well as President Trump, I often wondered what went on during those meetings. As a White House Advisor for four months, Dr. Scott Atlas, MD, gives his readers an inside look at those meetings and what the atmosphere of the West Wing was like during the height of the pandemic. Since Dr. Atlas had no political aspirations to protect, his views were unbiased, well-researched, and often met with backlash, anger, and even personal sabotage. Despite all this, he continued, and still does to this day, to speak the truth in his most sincere efforts to save lives as well as the country. In the last chapter of this book, Dr. Atlas quotes George Orwell's 1984, "The Party told you to reject the evidence of your eyes and ears. It was their final, most essential command. And if all others accepted the lie which the Party imposed-if all records told the same tale-then the lie passed into history and became truth." I was incredibly moved by his courage to stand his ground and fight for what he believes. I highly recommend this book!

Fall Book Sale

The library's Fall Book Sale, which took place from November 3-5, was the second-largest grossing book sale in the library's history, earning \$15,470 in revenue, with the Wright City and Pacific branches seeing their largest-ever grossing sale. The book sales have a range of materials for sale every year, including books, audiobooks, CDs, and DVDs. The Friends of the Library groups managed the book sale in eight of the library's locations. The library has an agreement under which the Friends' groups receive their branch's book sale proceeds if they manage the event, including setting up, recruiting, scheduling volunteers, and cleaning up. The next book sale will be in the spring.
