

Winter Bingo 2025: Be a Reading Machine



Scenic Regional Library's Winter Reading BINGO Program will return this year on January 1, lasting through February 28. All ages are encouraged to participate. To enroll in the program, pick up a BINGO card at your local branch or register online through Beanstack, an online reading tracking system. Each participant can earn up to two free books - one for a traditional bingo and one for a full card bingo.

Participants are encouraged to read and log at least 5 hours during the challenge. They can also complete activities such as attending a library program, checking out something that isn't a book, reading aloud to someone or having someone read aloud to them, or using the self-check machine.


Last Month's Most Popular Titles

"The Christmas Tree Farm" by Laurie Gilmore

If you love Hallmark movies but would like a bit more romance added, look no further than The Christmas Tree Farm by Laurie Gilmore

Kira North is a grumpy new owner of an old Christmas tree farm in the darling little town of Dream Harbor. One day, she stumbles upon Bennett Ellis, walking with his dogs on her newly acquired property. Bennett is on vacation in Dream Harbor and staying with his sister

while taking a break from his disastrous dating life.

Despite his determination to escape his reputation as a "fixer," Bennett can't seem to stay away from the tree farm, but stubborn Kira has a hard time accepting any of his help. Eventually, Bennet realizes Kira doesn't need all of the help he thinks she does, and Kira begins to question why she was so resistant to his offers in the first place. This book is advertised as a guaranteed "Happily Ever After," and it was the perfect way to start the Christmas season.

While this is the third in a series, I read it as a stand-alone, and you would never know the difference. This book is complete with quirky and lovable characters, small-town charm, Christmas feelings, and everything you could want from a steamy Gilmore Girlsesque Christmas story.

"Never Lie" by Freida McFadden

I've been a fan of Freida McFadden ever since I read her book The Housemaid. McFadden is a woman who only knows how to write home runs, and as such, I expect nothing but jaw-dropping twists from her. You'd think I would eventually catch on to her tricks and expect the unexpected, but nope, she gets me every time. I'm left grasping at straws till the very last page. She succeeded once again in her book Never Lie; my jaw was on the FLOOR for the whole second half of

the book. I cannot recommend giving this one a read enough, it's definitely a five-star book. In Never Lie, McFadden switches POVs all throughout in the most gravitating way. She jumps from voice to voice, starting with a young couple who have been stranded in an abandoned house. The house used to belong to a renowned psychiatrist— who happens to have disappeared, supposedly murdered, years ago. The only problem: they never found her body or her ex-boyfriend. When stuff starts moving around and the wife finds a mysterious room in the house, you begin to wonder if all is as it seems. Then, McFadden gives us the POV of said psychiatrist and her patients in the past, leaving one to wonder: did the psychiatrist ever really leave the house? Or is she still there? I was wondering how it all tied together, tossing accusations right and left, trying to figure out WHO IS THE KILLER HERE?! IS IT HIM?! OR HER?! IS SHE ACTUALLY DEAD?! By the time I thought I had it all figured out, piecing together the puzzle, McFadden's book decided to kick me while I was down and toss the aforementioned puzzle out the window. You think you know how her book is going to end? Guess again. Chances are, you're wrong— the twist at the end is one you'll never see coming until it's too late.

urning Point's domestic violence shelter in Warren County will have a collection drive in December at the Warrenton and Wright City branches of Scenic Regional Library. Turning Point is collecting items such as toilet paper, paper towels, laundry pods, 13-gallon trash bags, diapers sizes 4-6 T, feminine hygiene products, towels and washcloths, hair brushes, and packages of t-shirts, underwear, and socks, in all sizes for children and adults. The shelter often has 40+ women and children staying during the holiday season.
