#### Fall Book Sale Huge Success

The library's Fall Book Sale was a huge success. The much-anticipated event generated \$17,931 across the library's nine locations, making it the secondlargest sale to date, after the fall 2024 book sale. It was the largest-ever book sale at the Wright City, Hermann, and Sullivan branches.

Those who shopped the sale had their choice of books, audiobooks, CDs, and DVDs. The Friends of the Library groups managed the book sale in all nine library locations. The library has an agreement under which the Friends' groups receive their branch's book sale proceeds if they manage the event, including setting up, recruiting and scheduling volunteers, and cleaning up. The next book sale will be held in the Spring.

Her new role oversees larger system-wide programs such as Community Read, Adult Summer Reading Program, Adult Winter Reading Program, and other system-wide programming, while also supporting programmers at the branches. Richards has been with the library since 2023, when she was hired as Hermann's branch manager.

Previously, Richards worked as an Assistant Branch Manager at St. Louis County Library and a Branch Manager at Anoka County Library in Minnesota. She has a master's degree in Library and Information Science from the University of Wisconsin in Milwaukee. She began her new position on October 27.

#### Community Read Grant



Jeannine Cummins, Scenic Regional's 2026 Community Read Author.



he library was awarded a \$5,000 Presenter Grant through the Missouri State Library for its 2026 Community Read author visit. The author is Jeanine Cummins, who wrote the bestseller, "American Dirt," as well as the

Community Read book, "Speak to Me of Home." Collection Development Manager Paul Schroeder wrote the grant.

The library has already purchased 1,450 copies of the book, which will be distributed by the library, East Central College, and the Washington Public Library in late March 2026. The grant will cover the author's entire speaker fee. Also, the Scenic Regional Library Foundation has agreed to pay for the author's travel expenses. Cummins' visit is tentatively scheduled for April 30, 2026.

#### Server Grant


f I he library was awarded a \$4,855.85 grant from the Missouri State Library for a new Dell PowerEdge server to replace a 2017 server. The server hosts our two virtual servers for QuickBooks and Windows Server Update Services. It's also a redundant server, which allows the library to get back up and running if either of the two servers goes down. The library's other current server was purchased in 2022. The library's IT Manager, Denise Edwards, wrote the grant.




