## Scenic Regional Library offers ability to connect with others through community book read

Intending to unite communities in Franklin, Gasconade, and Warren counties, Scenic Regional Library, Washington Public Library, and East Central College (ECC) have partnered to host an annual community read each spring.

This year's community read kicked off Friday with a one-man theatrical performance by Clifton Truman Daniel, former United States President Harry S. Truman's grandson, titled "Give 'Em Hell, Harry!"

The comedic portrayal of Truman's life and presidency written by Samuel Gallu provided an introduction to the three titles chosen for this year's program.

Adults are reading "Harry Truman's Excellent Adventure: The True Story of a Great American Road Trip" Oby Matthew Algeo; youth are reading The Great Turkey Walk by Kathleen Karr; and the book chosen for the youngest readers is "Road Trip!" by Claudia Friddell.

The books are free to library patrons, although only 20 copies of "Turkey Walk" and one copy of "Road Trip!" were available at the Owensville branch on Tuesday.

Branch Manager Erica Mosley shared that other branches have copies available and anyone with a library card can utilize the library system's online book service, Libby, to read an e-book.

"The community read is one thing that we do to draw people in who may not be aware of the library, or might not be regular users," Mosley said. "We mostly just want people to know that the library is so much more than books. We have a lot of resources and want to be a community gathering place for everybody."

The library system has numerous events planned for the community read which runs through the end of March at the Owensville branch.

Book discussions will allow participants to join in the conversation to discuss the book's themes and ideas with others in their community. In Owensville, the first book discussion is tomorrow, March 7, at 11 a.m. A second discussion will take place locally on Tuesday, March 19, at 6 p.m.

Further book discussions will take place at other branches throughout the month as well for those willing to travel to another town.

The Owensville branch will host additional events this month:

• Sarah Newbanks from the Explorer Travel, Co., will host Road Trip Tips and Tricks on Thursday, March 7, at 6 p.m., discussing how to plan the perfect family road trip without breaking the bank.
