

Library Awarded with PreventEd Service Award

Scenic Regional Library has been selected by PreventEd as the recipient of its annual Service Award for 2024. The organization recognized the library for three partnerships, which include the distribution of medication disposable bags, allowing PreventEd's Peer Support Trailer to offer services in the St. Clair and Sullivan branch parking lots, and the placement of a Narcan vending machine at the St. Clair branch.

PreventEd's passion is empowering people to make positive life changes through connections between people and community resources. Their Certified Peer

Specialist program consists of individuals

who have been successful in recovery and help others experiencing similar situations. Through shared understanding, respect, and mutual empowerment, peer support workers help people become and stay engaged in the recovery process and reduce the likelihood of recurrence.

The library will receive the award at a luncheon held in St. Louis on April 26. Assistant Director Megan Maurer will accept the award on behalf of the library.

Novelist Connects to Catalog

 $R_{\text{eaders}} \\$ can now find read-alike books and place holds using the NoveList connection on Scenic Regional



Library's website. To use the service, patrons can visit scenicregional.org/ databases/#books, click "NoveList," and log in with their library card number. The link can also be found by searching for NoveList on the library website.

When viewing a book in NoveList, patrons can see if Scenic Regional Library owns it and if copies are available. A hold can be placed from this page. Books similar to the featured title are also displayed on the page and can be clicked to navigate to the page for the read-alike book. Each page contains aids for finding books that fit every reader's interests. Additional features of Novelist include discussion questions. lists of books in a series, and book reviews. NoveList is a library service powered by EBSCOhost.

St. Clair and Herman Awarded Grant for Color Printers

he St. Clair and Hermann branches of Scenic Regional Library were each awarded a \$2,000 grant from Ameren Missouri to purchase color printers for patron use. Color printing services are currently available at the Union and St. Clair branches; their new printers were installed in October and December. respectively. The Hermann branch's color printer is expected to be installed in January. Color prints cost \$0.35 per page.

The library plans to purchase color printers/copiers for all branches in 2024.


Purchase a "Book" for the Donor Wall in Your Community's New Library
