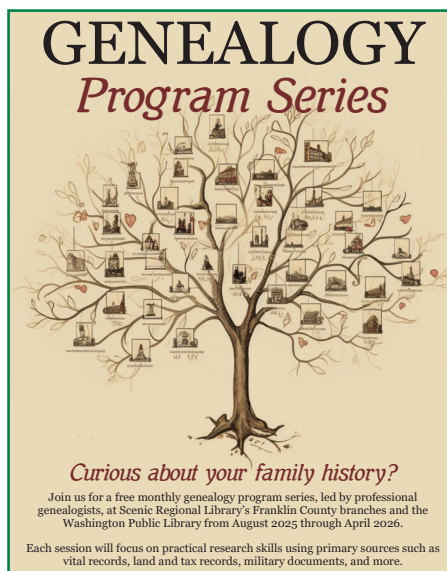
Explore Your Roots with the Library's Genealogy Program Series

Curious about your family history? There is still time to take part in Scenic Regional Library's free monthly genealogy program series. Scenic Regional Library partnered with the Washington Public Library and the Four Rivers Genealogical Society to present this ongoing series, with several expert-led programs still scheduled through the spring of 2026.

Each session has focused on research skills using primary sources such as vital records, land and tax records, military documents, court records, and more.

The remaining programs are being held at the library's Franklin County branches and are open for registration. The series is funded by a Missouri Humanities Council grant.

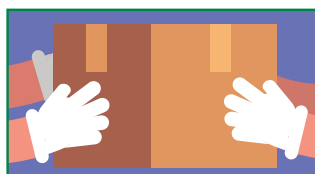
The StoryWalk™ consists of 16 signs along a one-mile walking trail. Each sign contains a page of a children's book.

All Branches are Warming Stations

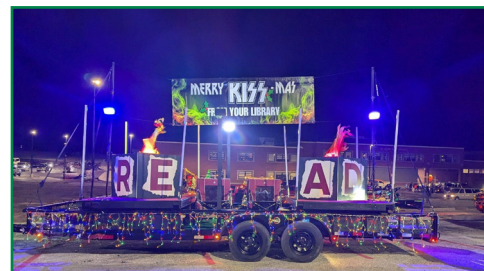

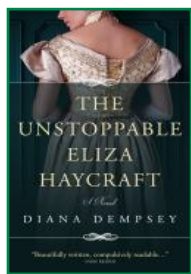


The Joplin Chronicles series

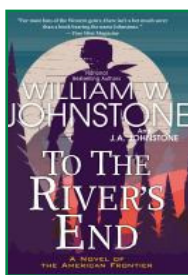


The Unstoppable Eliza Haycraft

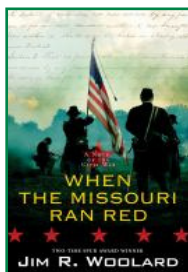


To the River's End

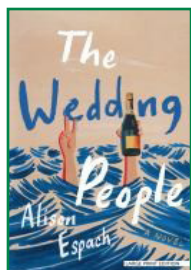

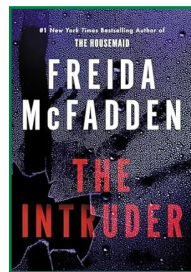


The Wedding People

It's a beautiful day in Newport, Rhode Island, when Phoebe Stone arrives at the grand Cornwall Inn wearing a green dress and gold heels, not a bag in sight, alone. She's immediately mistaken by everyone in the lobby for one of the wedding people, but she's actually the only guest at the Cornwall who isn't here for the big event. Phoebe is here because she's dreamed of coming for years—she hoped to shuck oysters and take sunset sails with her husband, only now she's here without him, at rock bottom, and determined to have one last decadent splurge on herself. Meanwhile, the bride has accounted for every detail and every possible disaster the weekend might yield except for, well, Phoebe and Phoebe's plan—which makes it that much more surprising when the two women can't stop confiding in each other.

In turns absurdly funny and devastatingly tender, Alison Espach's *The Wedding People* is ultimately an incredibly nuanced and resonant look at the winding paths we can take to places we never imagined—and the chance encounters it sometimes takes to reroute us.

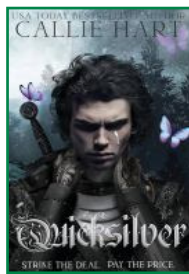
Hours later, they are lost. Hopelessly lost.

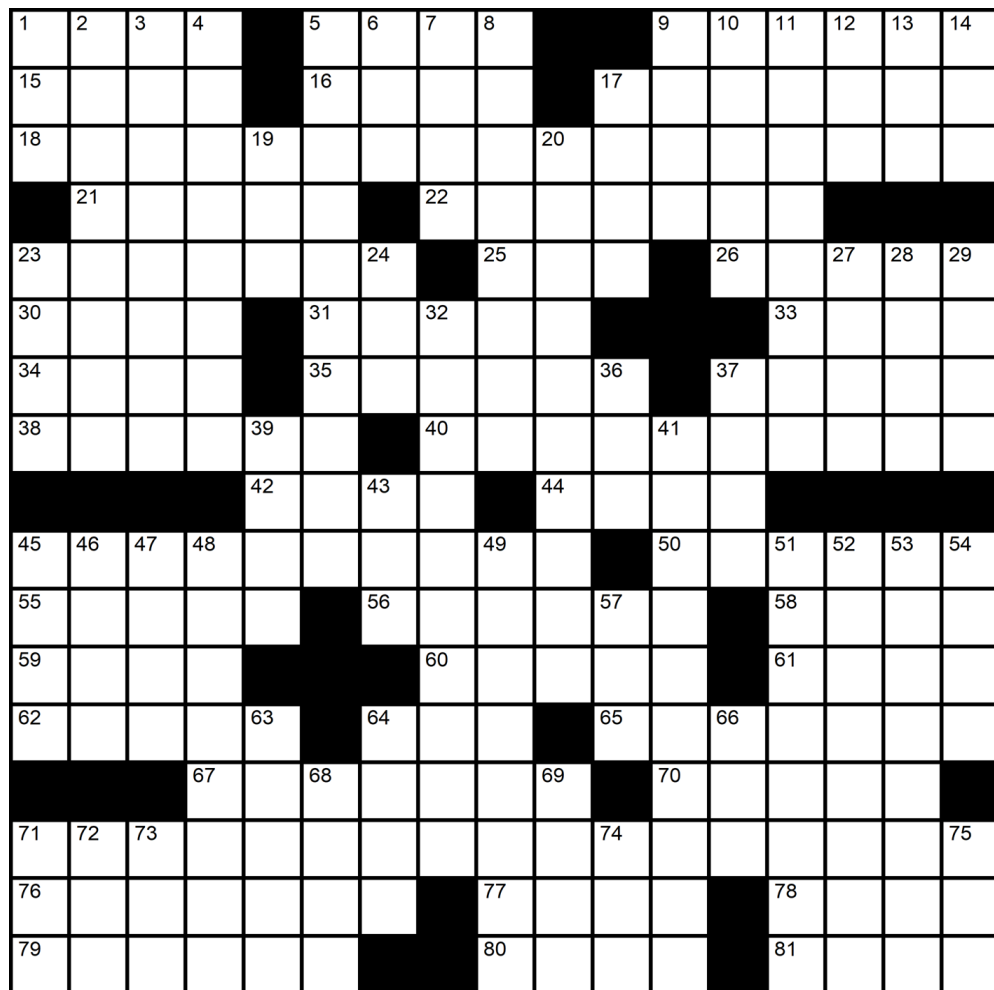
