

## Get Fit This Summer With the "100 Days, 100 Miles" Challenge!



It's not too late to begin the "100 Days, 100 Miles" challenge! From June 16 through September 23, participants are encouraged to complete

2,000 minutes of physical activity—just 20 minutes a day. Whether you walk, run, hike, bike, kayak, or engage in any exercise that adds up to the equivalent of 100 miles, every movement counts.

Participants will track their workouts in 20-minute increments using Beanstack, the same online platform the library uses for its Summer and Winter Reading Programs. Beanstack is also available as a convenient mobile app.

Everyone who completes the 100-mile or 2,000-minute challenge will receive a water bottle, courtesy of University of Missouri Extension, and be entered into a drawing to win one of four Fitbits. The Scenic Regional Library Foundation and the Washington Public Library Friends of the Library have generously provided



the Fitbits. The challenge is being hosted by Scenic Regional Library, Washington Public Library, and the University of Missouri Extension.

Participants are encouraged to snap photos of their workouts, share them on social media, and tag their local library and the University of Missouri Extension. Let's move together this summer—one mile at a time!

## Explore Your Roots with the Library's Genealogy Program Series



Curious about your family history? Scenic Regional Library has partnered with the Washington Public Library and Four Rivers Genealogical Society in Washington to present a free monthly genealogy program series. Each session will focus on research skills using primary sources such as vital records, land and tax records, military documents, court records, and more.

The series will consist of nine programs presented by professional genealogists from around the state.

The programs will be held at the library's Franklin County branches and the Washington Public Library between August 2025 and April 2026. The series is funded by a Missouri Humanities Council grant.

Bill Eddleman is a former professor at Southeast Missouri State University and president of the Cape County Genealogical Society. He produced an entire video series on conducting genealogical research for the State Historical Society of Missouri, which can be found on their website.

LaDonna Garner is a historic consultant, professional genealogist, and historic preservationist. She lectures at conferences, society events, and colleges. Garner is an active member of the Association of Professional Genealogists.

Pat Stamm was a professional genealogical researcher for over 30 years. Currently, she is a genealogical instructor for St. Louis Community College and the Institute of Genealogy and Historical Research. Stamm also lectures and teaches across the country.

Patti Lee Hobbs, a certified genealogist, serves on the editorial board for the National Genealogical Society Quarterly and is a former trustee of the Board for Certification of Genealogists and their Education Fund.

## **NEW CONTENT CONTROLS**

Libby for Everyone - Regular Libby with no restrictions by audience, except those users manually choose to apply.

Libby for Kids - Shows only titles for "juvenile" and "young adult" audiences when searching and browsing in Libby. Users can apply deep search, sample, and circulation restrictions to young adult titles if they wish.

Libby for Grown-ups - For people who borrow "general content" and "mature content" titles only. It prevents kids' titles from appearing at their libraries in Libby. Users who enjoy young adult titles can re-enable that content using a toggle within the preset.

## **Libby Introduces New Content Controls**

The library reading app from OverDrive

Libby, one of the library's online eBook and eAudiobook services, has introduced a new feature called Content Controls for a more personalized experience. The new optional feature enables users to customize the library content displayed in

Libby, either for themselves or for their family, based on the intended audience for each book, audiobook, and magazine in the library collection.

For typical use cases, users can choose from three simplified presets: Libby for Everyone, Libby for Kids, and Libby for Grown-ups.

Libby for Everyone is regular Libby, with no restrictions by audience except for those users manually choose to apply. Libby for Kids shows only titles for "juvenile" and "young adult" audiences when searching and browsing in Libby. Libby for Grown-ups is for individuals who borrow only "general content" and "mature content." It prevents kids' titles from appearing at their libraries in Libby. Users who enjoy young adult titles can reenable that content using a toggle within the preset.

Content Controls are located in the settings section of the menu. With the new features, users can also make decisions about how Libby displays "mature content" available at their libraries: whether it appears in deep search results, whether it can be sampled or borrowed, and whether cover images are visible or redacted. The new update also added the option for users to lock Content Control settings with a passkey.

## Franklin County Foster Closet Christmas in July Drive



Franklin County Foster Closet is gearing up for the Christmas season and will be collecting gifts for children in Franklin and Gasconade County branches of Scenic Regional Library during the month of July. Each year, the Franklin County Foster Closet provides Christmas gifts to over 300 children in Franklin and Gasconade counties in foster care. The organization hopes the Christmas in July program will gather all the gifts needed for teens, ensuring

they, too, can experience the joy of the holiday season.

The Franklin County Foster Closet serves local foster families by accepting donations from the community, which are then distributed to families supporting children impacted by foster care and adoption at no cost. The clothing boutique is located in the old cafeteria of The Family Resource Center and is available to Missouri licensed foster parents, relative placement providers (working with a caseworker), Missouri DSS caseworkers, CASA volunteers, school resource officers, biological parents who are working with a caseworker to prevent entry to foster care or nearing reunifications, and teens who qualify for other services at the Family Resource Center who have been identified by their team as homeless, at risk of being homeless, or in need of additional support.
