

Hermann Branch Opening June 27 Grand Opening July 23

Mark your calendars- the new Hermann branch will open on Monday, June 27! The branch will be closed June 22-25 to move to its new location.

A free grand opening event will happen on Saturday, July 23, from 11 AM - 1 PM. The dedication ceremony and ribbon cutting will begin at 11:30 AM. Former Hermann branch manager Sheri Hausman, Superintendent of Gasconade County R-I Schools, Dr. Geoff Neill, and Gasconade County Presiding Commissioner Larry Miskel will speak. The Hermann Chamber of Commerce will be present and conduct the ribbon cutting.

The free event will feature face painting, a balloon artist, a bounce house, hot dogs, chips, snow cones, drinks, music, and a live broadcast from KWRE.



Former Union Branch Sold

After spending nearly four and a half years on the market, the former Union branch of Scenic Regional Library is about to have a new owner! The library has reached an agreement with the Union R-XI School District to sell the building for \$950,000.

The Library Board of Directors and the Union R-XI Board of Education approved the purchase during May meetings. The closing date will take place June 8.



Big Spring Book Sale a Big Success

The library's Big Spring Book Sale was a big success. The much-anticipated Spring event generated \$14,167 at the library's nine locations. Those who shopped the sale had their choice of books, audiobooks, CDs, and DVDs. The Friends of the Library groups managed the book sale in eight of the library's locations. The library has an agreement under which the Friends' groups receive their branch's book sale proceeds if they manage the event, including set up, recruiting and scheduling volunteers, and clean up. The next book sale will be in the Fall.



Summer Reading Program - It's Not Just for Kids!

 $^{'}\Gamma$ he Summer Reading Program for adults is back for the 20th year! The "Oceans of Possibilities" program begins on June 1 and ends on August 15. To sign-up, go to the READsquared app (available for download from our website or the app store), register, and read. If a paper copy is preferred, stop by the branch of your choice to pick up a Challenge Form. Patrons can select from twenty different reading challenges and ten other challenges. Reading Challenge examples include: reading a book featured on a library display, reading a book with an island setting, and reading a book of your choosing. Other Challenge examples include: following the library on social media, writing a haiku about water, or attending a library program.



Complete the program by checking off three challenges and then stop by the branch of your choice to pick up a tote bag completion prize. Upon finishing three challenges, adult participants will have the opportunity to put raffle tickets into the prize drawing of their choice. Prize baskets are sponsored by the Friends of the Library and will vary between branches. There will also be three themed prize packages available to be won system-wide. Wright City Friends of the Library Auction

The Wright City Friends of the Library hosted a Naming Rights Auction at the Wright City branch on May 5. The event featured a Cinco De Salsa happy hour, and attendees had the opportunity to bid in a live auction for naming rights to 10 areas in the library for one year. In total, the auction raised \$3,100.

The areas which were available for naming were the two outdoor patios; the public meeting room; two study rooms; the adult, teen, and children's reading areas; the cafe area; and the service desk.

The winning bidder for each location will have a 22" x 28" full-color, framed sign placed in the area with the name of the individual, business, or organization, along with a photograph or logo. Bidders may also name an area in honor of a loved one or in memory of someone. Bidding for each area began at \$150.


Library Expands its Spanish Collection

CASA Seeking Volunteers for Franklin and Gasconade Counties

Franklin County Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) is looking for caring community members to become volunteer advocates for children in foster care in Franklin and Gasconade counties.

CASAs serve as the Court's "eyes and ears" for a foster child, speaking on their behalf and helping them through what is often a confusing and difficult time. They provide critical information to judges to help them in their decisions regarding a child. The monthly time commitment for a CASA is between 10 and 15 hours.



While no prior training is needed, volunteers are required to complete a 5-week training that includes online and in-person sessions. Trainings are held 3 times a year.
