

Library to Host Candidate Forums; Seeking Questions from Public

Scenic Regional Library and the Missourian Media Group will host two candidate forums for the August 6 primary election. The first event will be held Monday, July 8, at 6 PM at the Union branch. It will feature candidates running for Franklin County 2nd District Commissioner and Missouri Legislative District 119. The Franklin County 2nd District Commissioner race includes Ken Cox, while the Missouri Legislative District 119 race includes incumbent Brad Banderman and challenger Rafael Madrigal. Commissioner Dave Hinson has resigned as 2nd District Commissioner, but will still appear on the ballot. This is still a competitive race.

The second event will be held Tuesday, July 23, at 6 PM at the Washington Public Library and will feature candidates running for Franklin County 1st District Commissioner and Missouri Legislative District 109. The Franklin County 1st District Commissioner race includes incumbent Todd Boland and challenger Paul Overschmidt, while the Missouri Legislative District 109 race includes incumbent Kyle Marquart and challenger John Simmons.

 \prod he library's Spring Book Sale was a big success. The much-anticipated event generated \$17,333 at the library's nine locations, making it the second-largest sale to date. Those who shopped the sale had their choice of books, audiobooks, CDs, and DVDs. The Friends of the Library groups managed the book sale in all nine library locations. The library has an agreement under which the Friends' groups receive their branch's book sale proceeds if they manage the event, including setting up, recruiting and scheduling volunteers, and cleaning up. The next book sale will be in the Fall.

Scenic Regional Library Accepts Annual Service Award

Scenic Regional Library was awarded PreventEd's annual Service Award at a luncheon at the Hilton St. Louis Frontenac on April 26. Assistant Director Megan Maurer accepted the award on behalf of the library.

The organization recognized the library for three partnerships, which include distributing medication disposable bags, allowing PreventEd's Peer Support Trailer to offer services in the St. Clair and Sullivan branch parking lots, and placing a Narcan vending machine at the St. Clair branch. PreventEd's passion is empowering people to make positive life changes through connections between people and community resources. Their Certified Peer Specialist program consists of individuals who have been successful in recovery and help others experiencing similar situations. Through shared understanding, respect, and mutual empowerment, peer support workers help people become and stay engaged in the recovery process and reduce the likelihood of recurrence.

Summer Reading Program Returns

 Γ he Summer Reading Program is back for its 22nd year! The "Adventure Begins at Your Library" program began on June 1 and will end on August 17. This year, participants will track their reading time. Participants will earn a vinyl sticker after four hours of reading. When 8 hours are completed, children and teens will earn a book, and adults will receive a tote bag. All age groups will also be entered into the end-of-summer drawings upon completion. Participants will gain additional entries in the drawings for each additional task they accomplish after completion.



PreK and kids raffle prizes include various toys and games, and teen prizes include a phone charger/lantern, a scary movie basket, and a Steam gift card. For adults, each branch has three prize baskets, which are sponsored by the Friends of the Library. The baskets are themed around reading, hobbies, and coffee/tea, and the contents vary from branch to branch.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library Available Statewide

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is now available statewide in Missouri. Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is dedicated to inspiring a love of reading by delivering high-quality, age-appropriate books each month to the homes of registered children under age five at no cost to the family.

The Missouri Imagination Library was made possible by legislation (Section 178.694 RSMo) that identifies school districts as the local partner for this initiative. Full funding was included in DESE's Fiscal Year 2024 budget to establish and administer Dolly Parton's Imagination Library for all children in Missouri aged 0-5. The only requirement is for the child to be registered in the program. There is no cost to schools for the books or the postage to deliver them.


