Hermann Branch Flooding

On May 8, the Bavarian Hills Plaza, where the Hermann branch is located, experienced flash flooding. The city had received four inches of rain overnight in a short period, which overwhelmed the library's drainage system. The branch is not located in a flood plain. No books or artwork were damaged during the flooding. The following morning, library staff removed all of the books from the bottom shelves, allowing ServePro to extract all the water from the building and set up fans. Due to water damage inside the walls, ServePro also had to cut 2 feet of drywall from the floor up, throughout the entire building to remove the mud and wet insulation from inside the walls and allow the metal study to dry.

The library and gallery are currently closed until further notice, and programs are taking place off-site. Due to the need to order new carpet, laminate end panels, and casework, the branch will be closed for at least two more months. Summer Reading Program Happening Now!



Summer Reading Program is in full swing here at the library! This year's theme is Color Our World, and we have prizes and programs for all ages. The program began on May 31.

This year, participants will complete the program by reading for 50 days over the summer! To track their reading, they may either pick up a paper reading log from their branch or use the Beanstack app to keep track of their reading, earn badges, and maintain their reading streak.

Summer reading is important because kids reading in the summer is important. Children who are given access to books over the summer perform 35-40% better on reading achievement tests than those without access to

books. And kids who don't read in the summer experience drastic losses in reading skills, losing up to 3 months of reading development.

Those who complete the program will earn a completion prize - a book for kids and teens and a library-themed pint glass for adults. Each participant can also put their name into a drawing for additional prizes! Adults will have the opportunity to put raffle tickets into the prize drawing of their choice. Each branch will have three baskets with different themes: Book/Reading, Coffee/Tea, and Hobby. Contents of the baskets will vary by branch. Suggest a Purchase Change

On June 16, the library will introduce a new method for patrons to suggest materials for purchase using the library's new Discovery Layer catalog at https://srl.modiscovery.org/. This will replace the current form available on the library's website. This new system requires patrons to sign into their online library account to submit their requests. They will then be able to keep track and see the status of their requests directly from their library account. If an email address is provided, patrons will receive emailed updates about the status of their purchase request. Patrons will be limited to 7 active purchase requests at a time. Staff will be available to assist patrons, and the library will also provide instructions on the website and at the branches.

Volunteer Spotlight: Ted, Union Branch



Regular visitors to the Union branch may have begun noticing a new face among the stacks. Ted Willis began volunteering at the branch last fall, following his retirement from a 45-year career in the aerospace industry.

Willis was born in Philadelphia and grew up in northern New Jersey. He attended college and graduate school in upstate New York, where he earned his Bachelor's degree in physics and Master's degree in optics. He moved to St. Louis in 1978 and to the Franklin County area in 1981 with his wife.

Willis worked in aerospace for 45 years at McDonnell Douglas, which later became Boeing. During his career, he had the chance to work on spacecraft, jet aircraft, helicopters, and submarines.

He retired from his position as a technical fellow in 2021.

With retirement, his wife urged him to get out of the house and keep busy. Willis describes himself as a nerdy kid who loves books, so he thought the library would be a natural fit.

A majority of his volunteer time is spent helping in the back and helping Interlibrary Loan Clerk Becky with the delivery, packing, and unpacking of books that are being distributed across the system. Willis has also helped with shelving, assembling banners, assembling kits, and various other tasks that need to be completed.

When asked about his favorite part of volunteering at the library, Willis stated that he was surprised to see how extensive the library system was and the breadth of things offered. "It boggles the mind," he said. "It's interesting to see how this is different from the libraries I remember.

Get Fit This Summer With the "100 Miles, 100 Days" Challenge!



Scenic Regional Library, Washington Public Library, and University of Missouri Extension are teaming up this summer to motivate the community to get active with the "100 Miles, 100 Days" challenge! From June 16 through September 23, participants are encouraged to complete 2,000 minutes of physical activity—just 20 minutes a day. Whether you walk, run, hike, bike, kayak, or engage in any exercise that adds up to the equivalent of 100 miles, every movement counts.

Participants will track their workouts in 20-minute increments using Beanstack, the same online platform the library uses for its Summer and Winter Reading Programs.

Beanstack is also available as a convenient mobile app.

Everyone who completes the 100-mile or 2,000-minute challenge will receive a water bottle, courtesy of University of Missouri Extension, and be entered into a drawing to win one of four Fitbits. The Fitbits have been generously provided by the Scenic Regional Library Foundation and the Washington Public Library Friends of the Library.


Participants are encouraged to snap photos of their workouts, share them on social media, and tag their local library and University of Missouri Extension. Let's move together this summer—one mile at a time!


