Summer Reading Program Happening Now!



Scenic Regional Library's Summer Reading Program is officially underway, and this year's theme, **UNEARH A STORY™**, is inviting patrons of all ages to discover the joy of reading all summer long. The program features reading challenges, prizes, and events for children, teens, and adults throughout the summer season.

To celebrate, several branches will host special Dino-Roar Kick-Off events featuring 7-foot-tall life-like dinosaurs, fossil digging, bounce houses, face painting, balloon animals, icy treats, and more.

Participants in the Summer Reading Program can track their reading using the Beanstack app, where they can log reading, earn badges, and maintain their reading streak throughout the summer. Paper reading logs are also available at library branches.

Summer reading helps children maintain and strengthen reading skills while school is out and encourages lifelong learning and a love of reading for all ages. Those who complete the program will earn a completion prize, including a book for kids and teens and a themed keychain for adults. Participants may also enter prize drawings for additional rewards. Adult prize baskets, sponsored by the Friends of the Library, will vary by branch.

Library Seeking Volunteers to Select 2027 Community Read Book



Scenic Regional Library and its partners are currently seeking volunteers for the 2026 Community Read Selection Committee, which will meet four times to discuss and choose the book for next year's Community Read. Free Breakfast and Lunch Distribution for Kids



Foundation for Strengthening Families, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization based out of St. Louis, will partner with Scenic Regional Library this summer to provide free weekly meal packs for children at select branch locations from June 29 through August 17. Families will receive a week's worth of breakfasts and lunches, with items such as pancakes, waffles, French toast sticks, chicken, hamburgers, hot dogs, tuna, fruit, vegetables, and milk.

The library has an agreement under which the Friends' groups receive their branch's book sale proceeds if they manage the event, including setting up, recruiting and scheduling volunteers, and cleaning up. Former Pacific Branch Manager Sue Reed Passes Away



Former Pacific Branch Manager Sue Reed passed away on Wednesday, May 6, 2026. Mrs. Reed managed the Pacific Branch from 1964 to 2009, guiding it through decades of growth, multiple locations, and expanded services. During her 45 years with the library, she became known as the “story lady” to several generations of children and families.

In addition to her work at the library, Mrs. Reed had a deep passion for local history. She collected newspaper clippings about important events, buildings, and people, creating an archive that became the foundation for a much larger Meramec Valley history collection. She was instrumental in founding the Meramec Valley Historical and Genealogical Society, whose archive is now housed near the Red Cedar Inn Museum and Visitor Center and remains available to researchers. She also authored *In Retrospect*, Pacific’s first comprehensive history book.

Mrs. Reed was active in many community organizations, including Pacific Presbyterian Church, P.E.O. Chapter BU, P.A.T.H. Council, and the Meramec Valley Historical and Genealogical Society. She also enjoyed helping her husband with the family farm and animals, gardening, and the arts.

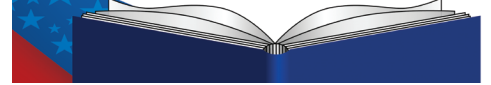

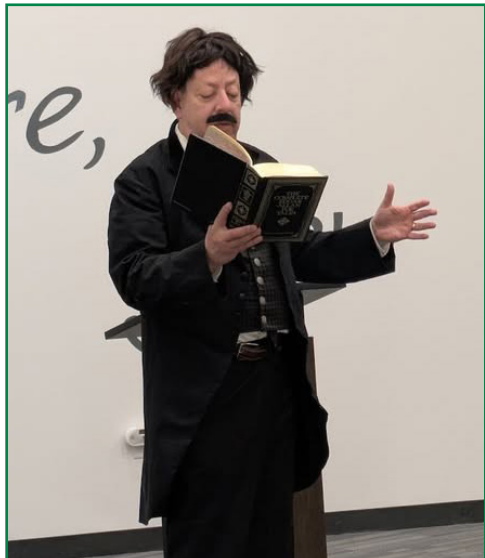

Scenic Regional Library has received the 2026 Gold Trefoil Award from the Girl Scouts of Eastern Missouri (GSEM), a council-level honor recognizing organizations whose contributions create a lasting impact across the region.

The award was presented to Assistant Director Megan Maurer during the 2026 GSEM Volunteer Recognition Ceremony held May 2 at Edward Jones headquarters.

The library was recognized for expanding access to technology and digital literacy through services such as mobile computer labs, Wi-Fi hotspots, and virtual support, and for building

partnerships that extend services to underserved populations. The award also highlighted the library's efforts to provide safe, welcoming, and accessible services during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Case Managers can assist individuals in finding resources related to housing, food, childcare, healthcare, employment, and transportation. They can also provide guidance for accessing support services such as mental health care, counseling, domestic violence resources, and substance use treatment. In addition, assistance is available for applying for benefits, including SNAP, Medicaid, unemployment, and disability, as well as replacing important documents such as IDs and birth certificates.

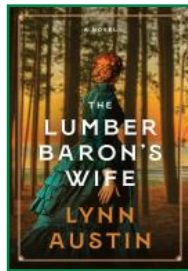

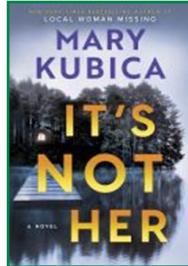

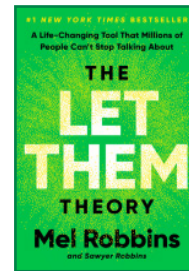


It's Not Her

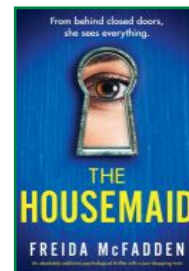

“The Trunk” serves foster youth, adoptive families, and kinship families by providing gently used clothing, shoes, baby items, and home goods for free.

CMFCAA currently operates three brick-and-mortar “The Trunk” locations in Rolla, Osage Beach, and Jefferson City, but launched the mobile boutique to better serve families in communities farther from those locations.

A formal placement letter or adoption decree is recommended for those wishing to shop at the boutique. Families may also create a profile in advance by visiting mofosteradopt.com. There are no geographic restrictions to shop with the mobile boutique.

The St. Clair branch of Scenic Regional Library and the St. Clair Historical Museum are teaming up to celebrate 100 years of Route 66 with a special Route 66 Centennial Cruise-In on Saturday, June 13, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Community members are invited to rev their engines and roll into downtown St. Clair for a day celebrating the historic “Mother Road” with classic cars, music, and Route 66 nostalgia. The Cruise-In is part of Scenic Regional Library’s larger Centennial celebration honoring the highway that has long been woven into the history of Pacific, St. Clair, and Sullivan.

The event will feature a variety of classic and vintage vehicles, giving visitors the chance to stroll through rows of cars while enjoying the atmosphere of one of America’s most iconic highways. Families, car enthusiasts, and Route 66 fans alike are encouraged to attend.

Additional Route 66-themed activities will also take place throughout the day at the St. Clair branch, including “Local Memories of St. Clair Route 66” at 11 a.m., where community members will share stories and memories connected to the historic roadway, followed by “Meet the King” at noon, featuring a live Elvis tribute performance by James Weber.

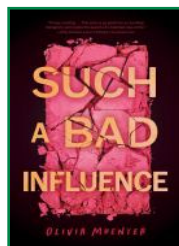

When influencer Evie Davis suddenly disappears, her older sister Hazel is forced to investigate the carefully crafted online

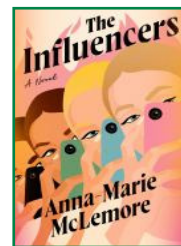

After discovering her estranged twin sister Chloe, a wealthy influencer, is dead, struggling supermarket cashier Julie Chan

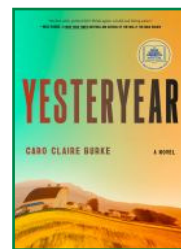

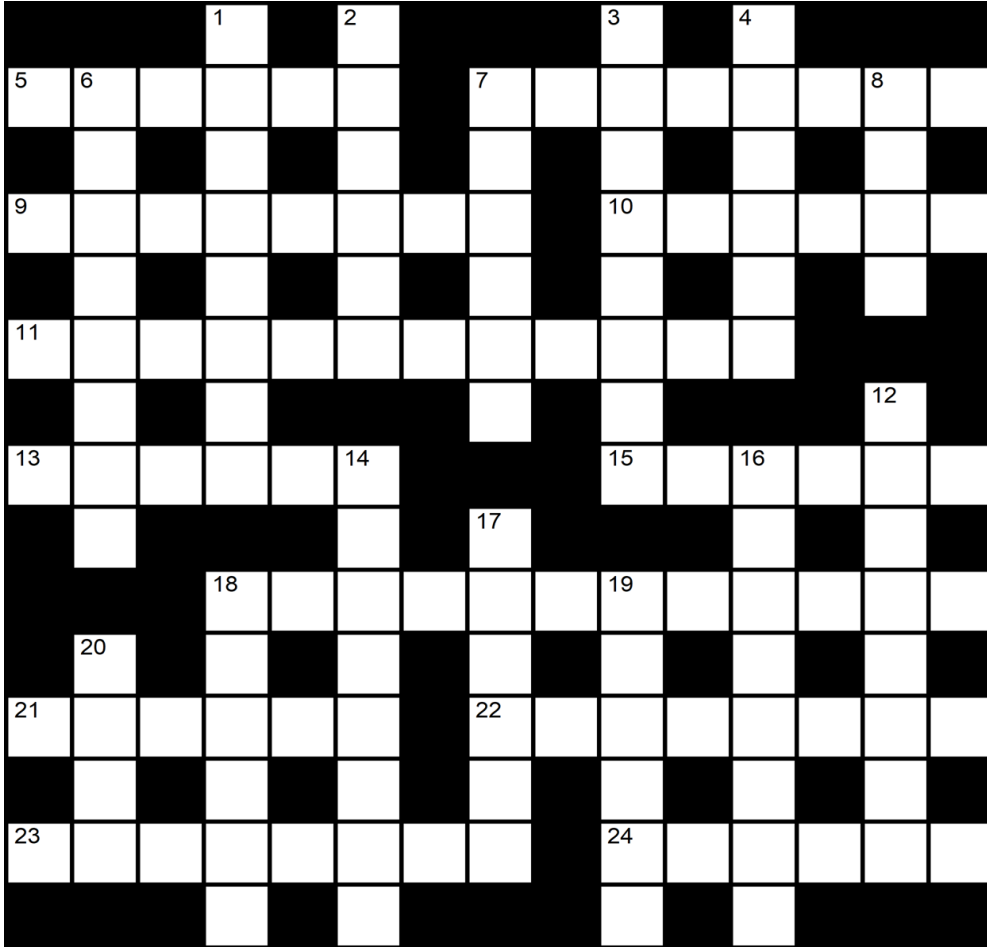
