Participants in the program can use the Beanstack app to keep track of their reading, earn badges, and keep their reading streak going. Those who complete the program will earn a completion prizea book for kids and teens and a tote bag for adults. Each participant can also put their name into a drawing for additional prizes! Adults will have the opportunity to put raffle tickets into the prize drawing of their choice. Prize baskets will vary between branches and be sponsored by the Friends of the Library.

Multiple branches will have Summer Reading Program kick-off events this year on Saturday, June 1! The New Haven, Pacific, Sullivan, and Warrenton branches will host their respective events from 11 am to 1 pm. The events will feature a bounce house obstacle course, face painting, balloon twisting, popcorn, hotdogs, and drinks.

The Owensville branch will host its kickoff event from 9 to 11 am, with donuts, drinks, face painting, and a live DJ.

The St. Clair branch's kick-off event will be from 11 am to 1 pm. Kids Bingo will take place from 11 am to noon, followed by adult Bingo, sno cones, and a clown twisting balloon animals from noon to 1 pm.

#### Medicine Lock Boxes and Gun Locks Available to Patrons

In May, Scenic Regional Library began distributing gun locks, medication lock boxes, and Deterra drug disposal bags, which are used to safely and permanently dispose of unused prescriptions and over-the-counter medication. The library has



partnered with Foundations for Franklin County, Franklin County CRUSH, Franklin County Youth Coalition, HOPE for Franklin County, and Mid-Mo Addiction Awareness Group for the medication lock boxes and Deterra bags. The U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) donated the gun locks. The library received 250 lockboxes and 250 gun locks to distribute among all branches. In the past, the library distributed 250 medication lock boxes, 250 Deterra drug disposal bags, and 250 gun trigger locks to patrons. ## Senior Farmer Market Nutrition Program Open for Enrollment

The Senior's Farmer's Market Nutrition Program is back for the 2024 season in Franklin County, Missouri. Starting May 1, residents aged 60 years and older with incomes within 185% of the federal poverty guidelines can register to receive \$50 of benefits to spend with enrolled farmer's market vendors. Last year, participants in Franklin County received \$900 in benefits, allowing them to purchase various fresh produce, including tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, and zucchini. Enrollment for the program will be open from May 1 to September 31. Residents can sign up at community enrollment fairs or at the Extension Center in Union (100 Union Plaza Drive, Union, MO 63084). She has also served on church councils in various roles and as an officer in multiple PEO chapters. Currently, she volunteers as a CASA. Ms. Fleming is a member of the book club at the Hermann branch and has also volunteered at the library's book sale.


