Owensville Lions Club Donates Funds for AED Device

At their meeting on November 5, the Owensville Lions Club presented a \$2,000 donation to Library Director Steve Campbell to purchase an AED device for the Owensville branch. An AED is a portable, life-saving device designed to treat people experiencing sudden cardiac arrest, a medical condition in which the heart stops beating suddenly and unexpectedly. The Hermann branch also has an AED device, which the Hermann Area Ambulance District donated.


The library is seeking funds from service organizations and grants to place an AED device at every branch.

The Wright City branch and Wright City Cemetery Memorial Society hosted an amazing cemetery walk and discussion about local history in the area.



30 Tonieboxes Added to Collection

Ocenic Regional Library has added 30 more Tonieboxes to its collection, making 55 Tonie kits that are now circulating. Since adding 25 kits to its collection in late 2023, the Tonieboxes have proven popular, with each kit averaging seven holds at any time. Extremely popular kits, such as superheroes, princesses, and Paw Patrol, have had a second kit added with this expansion. New kit themes include music, travel, dinosaurs, comedy, and more.

m With the holidays approaching, don't forget the library has specialty cake pans available for checkout! With 150+ designs, there is truly something for everyone. The library began offering cake pans in 2019. The collection consists of various shapes, such as multiple holiday-themed pans, Darth Vader, Harry Potter, a T-Rex, a train, a Christmas tree, and a T-shirt.

Each pan can be borrowed for two weeks and renewed once. Borrowing a cake pan is free, but if it is returned dirty, there is a \$5.00 cleaning fee. If a particular cake pan is



1st – *Verity* by Colleen Hoover - Lowen Ashleigh is a struggling writer on the brink of financial ruin when she accepts the job offer of a lifetime. *Whose truth is the lie?* Stay up all night reading the sensational psychological thriller that has readers obsessed. **Genres: Thriller, Mystery, Romance, Fiction**

2nd – *Too Late* by Colleen Hoover - A story about a woman caught in a dangerous web of obsessive love, trying to find a way out before it's too late.

Genres: Romance, Thriller, Fiction

3rd (tied) – If It Bleeds by Stephen King -A collection of four new novellas —Mr. Harrigan's Phone, The Life of Chuck, Rat, and the title story If It Bleeds— each pulling readers into intriguing and frightening places.


