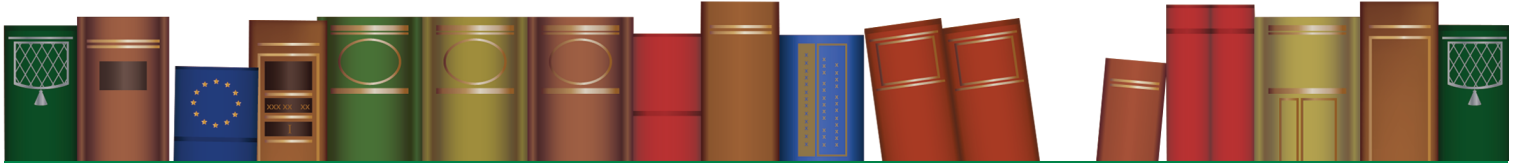

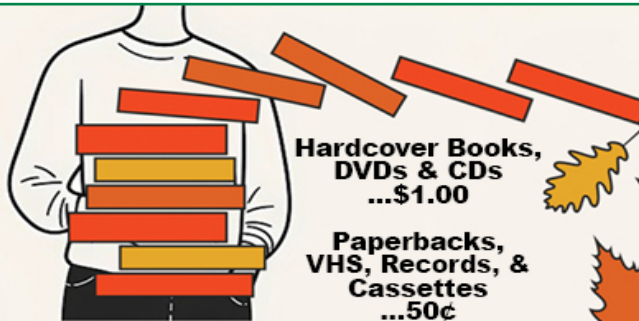

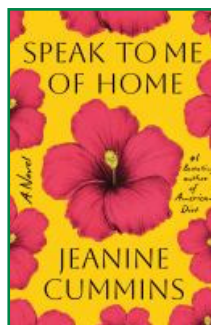

Speak to Me of Home Chosen as 2026 Community Read

The 2026 Community Read Selection Committee has chosen *Speak to Me of Home* by Jeanine Cummins as next year's title! Each year, Scenic Regional Library partners with Washington Public Library and East Central College to host an annual Community

Read. The goal is to have as many people reading and discussing the same book at the same time. Over four weeks, the library and its partners will distribute over 1,400 free copies and present many programs that represent the book's themes. The book is historical and literary fiction. It was published in 2025. Cummins is also the author of the bestseller "American Dirt." The community read will occur in April 2026, and books will be distributed beginning in late March 2026.

Library Wins MLA Community Partnership Award

Scenic Regional Library was awarded the Missouri Library Association's (MLA) 2025 Community Partnership Award. Assistant Director Megan Maurer accepted the award at a gala during the MLA Annual Conference in St. Louis on October 9. The Coalition has provided the library with funding to purchase more than 1,200 locking medicine boxes, hundreds of Detera bags and other wellness supplies for library patrons. The Library has hosted Prevent+Ed's Certified Peer Specialist trailer at several branches, affording patrons the opportunity to get immediate assistance. Several Scenic Regional Library staff have served on the HOPE Coalition. With this partnership, the Library's St. Clair Branch acquired a naloxone vending machine for free naloxone distribution. A second machine was installed at another branch in 2025. The Library has disbursed more than 1,000 doses of life-saving naloxone from this collaboration.

Library Releases 2024-2025 Annual Report



The library has released its annual report for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, which ended June 30. Among this year's highlights were the opening of a community garden at the Owensville branch and the five exhibits at The Gallery at the Library in the Hermann branch: "At Play," "Fiber Connections," "Stories," "Missouri Masters," as well as a fundraiser. The library showed high usage throughout the year, with many increases. Over 346,000 people visited the library's nine branches; 6,056 new library cards were issued, and there were 12,014 active users. In addition, the library checked out 422,845 physical items and 289,202 digital items, such as e-books and e-audiobooks. The total number of digital checkouts reflects a 9% increase from the previous year.

The library checked out 5,289 non-traditional items such as telescopes, headphones, cake pans, microscopes, hotspots, and Chromebooks, and added board games, cornhole boards, and projectors to the collection.

In 2024-2025, the library offered 573 adult programs, reaching 8,374 people, a 6.35% increase from the previous year, and 1,035 children and teen programs attended by 25,177 people. Library staff also facilitated 210 visits to 2,654 senior citizens at nursing homes and senior centers in all three counties.

The fiscal year also saw the fourth annual Community Read, an event designed to encourage discussion by having as many people as possible read the same book simultaneously. The book chosen for the 2025 Community Read was *Flower Sisters* by Michelle Collins Anderson. The library and its partners gave away 1,105 free copies to the public. Over four weeks, the Community Read saw 63 themed programs with 1,173 attendees.

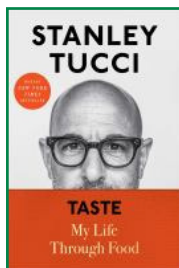
Wright City Christmas Toy Drive

satisfying treat for both self-proclaimed foodies and film buffs. If you love food you need to read this book!

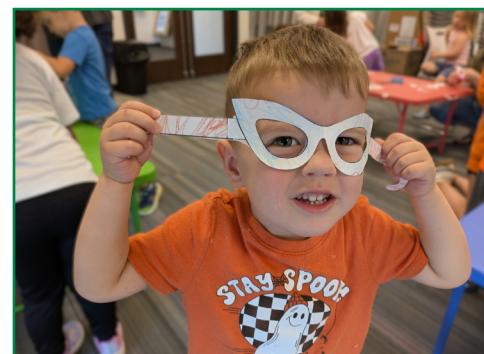

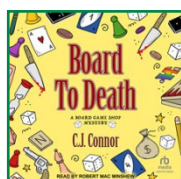

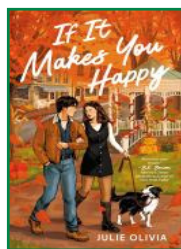

 by Lisa See

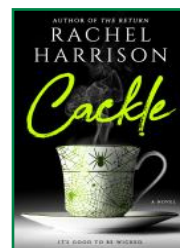

Annie can't help but gravitate toward the self-possessed Sophie, wanting to spend more and more time with her, even though the rest of the townsfolk seem...a little afraid of her.

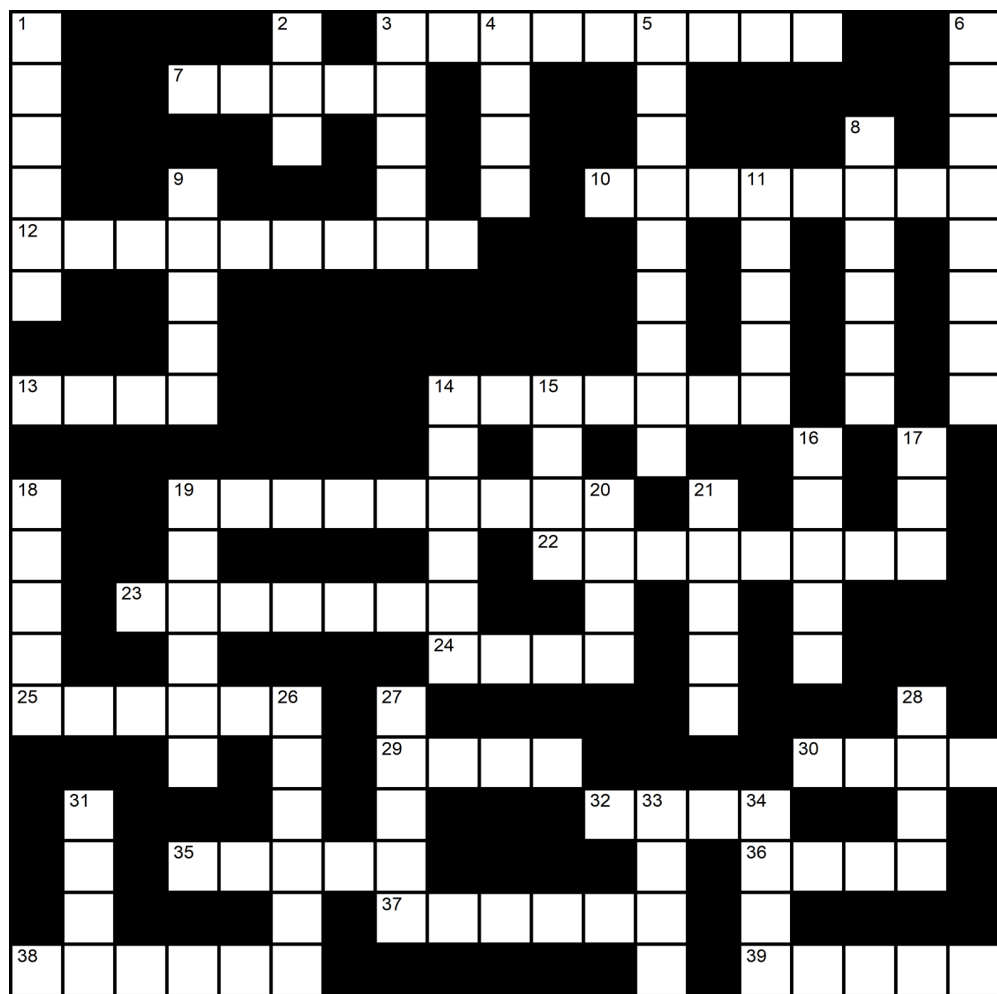

Purchase a "Book" for the Donor Wall in Your Community's New Library

The Scenic Regional Library Foundation and Friends of the Library groups are selling donor wall "books", which will be placed in the entrance hallway of each new library building.

You can have your name, your family's name, or your business's name become a permanent part of the new library in your community. Donor wall "books" can also serve as a beautiful and long-lasting memorial for a loved one.

The cost of a donor wall "book" is based on the size of the book:

- 8" x 1½" book – \$150
- 10" x 2" book – \$250
- 9" x 3" book – \$350
