General Contractor Selected for New Hermann Branch

The Scenic Regional Library's Board of Trustees accepted a bid from Franklin County Construction for the new Hermann branch at their September 21 meeting. Construction on the \$2.5 million project will begin in early October and be completed by June 1, 2022. The new facility, located in the former Alco building, will include a 1,000 square foot public meeting room and 2,000 square foot community art gallery.



The Hermann Area Hospital has leased 11,000 square feet of the

building from the library for construction of a new medical clinic, which is expected to open in the fall of 2022.

Owensville Resident Appointed to the Library Foundation Board

On September 21, the Scenic Regional Library's Board of Trustees approved the appointment of Owensville resident Jo Ellen Steineker to the library's



Foundation Board of Directors. The position represents Gasconade County; the term will be from August 1, 2021 until July 30, 2024.

Ms. Steineker is a retired special education teacher, who taught for 31 years in New Haven and Owensville. She grew up in Gerald, earned her associate's degree from East Central College, and bachelor's degree from the University of Central Missouri in Warrensburg.

Literacy Council's First Fundraiser a Big Success

On September 10, the Franklin County Literacy Council held its first fundraiser. Six members of the Council collected \$1,700 in donations over a four-hour span at the intersection of Jefferson and Fifth Streets in Washington, in front of the Washington Public Library.

The funds will go toward scholarships for adults who are improving their skills through the East Central Adult Education and Literacy (AEL)

Library's Fall Book Sale Biggest Ever

The library's first book sale in two years was a big success. The much-anticipated fall event generated \$17,016 at the library's nine locations. The library's previous biggest sale was in the spring of 2019, when \$13,413 in books, audiobooks, CDs and DVDs were sold.

Seven of the library's nine branches had their biggest sale ever. The Sullivan branch missed a record sale by only \$9. The Union branch's sale alone generated \$3,221, almost \$1,000 more than their previous biggest sale.

The Friends of the Library groups managed the book sale in seven of the library's nine locations. The library has an agreement under which the Friends' groups receive their branch's book sale proceeds if they manage the event, including set up, recruit and schedule volunteers, and clean up.

The library's next book sale will be in the spring.

Self-check Added at Hermann and New Haven Branches

In late September, self-check systems were installed at the Hermann and New Haven branches. They were the last two locations without self-check. The two systems were purchased with a \$20,000 grant through the Missouri State Library, which offered public libraries multiple special grant opportunities this summer through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA).

The new systems were purchased through Tech Logic, the company the library has contracted with for its RFID project. The library's other seven systems

Missouri Ozarks Community Action to Assist Families at Owensville Branch

 ${f B}$ eginning in October, the Missouri Ozarks Community Action, Inc. (MOCA) will be offering services at the Owensville branch twice each month. MOCA is a non-profit community action agency which administers government resources to low-income families for eight counties, including Gasconade. Gasconade County is the most underserved part of their service area.

MOCA offers a wide-range of services for low-income families, including energy assistance, emergency rental assistance, Head Start, Section 8 Housing, and assistance with home weatherization.

MOCA will have its 24' van in the Owensville branch's parking lot from 10 AM to 12 PM and 12:30 to 4 PM on the first and third Wednesday of each month. The public can board the van and get assistance from MOCA staff in applying for services and ask questions about eligibility.


