STEM Kits Added to Catalog

B eginning October 1, you can check out one of our new STEM Kits, which are now part of our collection of non-traditional items!

In total, the library added 148 kits to its catalog. The kits span 50+ themes and are designed to allow children ages pre-k through fourth grade to engage with science, technology, engineering, and math. Each branch has 10-20 kits available to check out. From phonics to coding, to the human body, and much more- we have a theme for every child!

The library was awarded a \$20,000 grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services to purchase and assemble the kits. To learn more about the kits, visit us at scenicregional.org/stemkits.

These kits were purchased with funds from the Institute of Museum and Library Services under the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act as administered by the Missouri State Library, a division of the Office of the Secretary of State. Freegal Increases Streaming Time



F reegal, the free music streaming app offered through the library, has recently increased the daily streaming time available to patrons from 5 to 8 hours!

Freegal offers access to about 8 million songs, including Sony Music's catalog of legendary artists and over 15,000 music videos. In total, the collection comprises music from over 28,000 labels, with music originating in over 100 countries. There is no software to download and no digital rights management (DRM) restrictions.

To get started on Freegal, download the Freegal app from your app store and log in with your library card number!

Y Literacy Seeking Tutors and Adult Students

The Community Literacy program at the Four Rivers Family YMCA is looking for tutors and adult students who want to improve their literacy goals. Y Literacy is a free program for adults struggling with the English language and literacy skills that partner with the public libraries in Franklin County to provide tutoring at convenient locations. Adult students meet with a trained volunteer one-to-one once a week to address individual goals.

Adults who would like to tutor must attend a training session provided by the Y. The next training session will be Tuesday, October 18 at the Washington Library at noon.

This four-hour session is the first step to become a tutor. Attending the training does not commit someone to become a volunteer- it's the first step Adults who participate in Y Literacy have a variety of goals:

Library Purchases Land in Wright City

On September 16, the library purchased a .87-acre tract behind the current branch from the Wright City R-II School District for \$50,000. The library purchased the existing 1.15-acre lot from the school district in 2015. The purchase will allow the library to expand the current 7,700 sq. ft. facility up to 8,000 additional square feet in the future.

The purchase prepares the library for accommodating the rapid population growth in the county. Over the past five years, since the community's branch opened, Wright City's population has grown 65%—and more growth appears on the horizon. In 2021, Minneapolis, Minnesota-based American Foods Group announced the construction of a 500,000-square-foot beef processing facility between Wright City and Foristell. The plant, set to open in 2024, is expected to create more than 1,300 new jobs. The company is expected to invest up to \$450 million in the project.




"Our Rainbow Queen-A Tribute to Queen Elizabeth II and Her Colorful Wardrobe" by Sali Hughes

"My Name is Yip" by Paddy Crewe

I don't know why this book has been labeled by the publisher as a Western. The setting is Appalachia. Eastern Appalachia. The action takes place in the early 1800s, and there are horses, a gold rush, and some pretty wild goings-on, but I wouldn't call it a Western.

What I WOULD say is that Paddy Crewe knocked the ball over the fence with this, his first novel. It is a one-of-a-kind coming-of-age story whose protagonist is a keen observer of human nature and is also mute. Because he is shunned as different from other children,

he spends most of his time watching the customers at his mother's general store from a vantage point across the street. She doesn't have time to do more than prepare food for him and make sure his clothes are mended. But a couple of others recognize his intelligence and make him a participant in their lives with some astonishing results. He learns to read and write. He is a near-witness to murder and then kills a man himself before he is fifteen. His misadventures while trying to hide in the hills had me on the edge of my seat.

Paddy Crewe is an Englishman, but My Name is Yip was written in the vernacular of a resident of 1800s Appalachia. I think the voice is unerring, and the book is near perfection.
