

Old Administration Building Sold

The former Library Administration Building, located at 304 Hawthorne Drive in Union, was sold to Emmendorger Exteriors LLC for \$330,000. The building was renovated in 2015 and served as the library's administrative offices until 2019. The library closed on the deal on September 29.

Staff Spotlight: Sarah Marketing Specialist, Administration



How long have you worked for Scenic

I began working at Scenic in 2017 at the St. Clair branch as an adult programmer but left in February 2020 to pursue career opportunities closer to my degree. In 2021, they created the Marketing Specialist position, and I immediately applied. I have been in this position for almost two years now.

Can you share a little bit about your background before you came to work at the library?

I earned a double major degree in Public Relations and Advertising and Mass Communications with an emphasis in Media Management and Sales from Lindenwood University in 2016. When I left the library in 2020, I worked as a reporter for the St. Clair section of The Missourian, and right before I began my job as the marketing specialist, I worked at a boutique in St. Clair.

What made you want to work in a library?

I am a small-town girl through and through, and I love being involved in our communities! The library is an invaluable resource to all three counties we serve.

What do you wish more people knew about the library?

We have so much to offer! You name it, we probably have it - and I'm not just talking about books! We have FREE digital streaming services for eBooks, eAudiobooks, music, movies, etc.; an extensive collection of genealogy databases; Pronunicator for learning a foreign language; live online tutoring; online veteran assistance; and much more!

What is your favorite part of the job? Why?

My favorite part of the job is informing people of an item or service they have yet to learn we have. Believe it or not, it never gets old to hear someone say, "You have cake pans and fishing poles?!"

What are you currently reading, or what are you reading next?

I usually have a fiction book and a nonfiction book going simultaneously. I just finished reading *The In-Between: Unforgettable Encounters During Life's Final Moments* by Hadley Vlahos, RN, and *No Exit* by Taylor Adams. Both were excellent reads.

You can only take one book to a desert island. What book, and why?

I wish I could say I would take my favorite classic, *Anne of Green Gables*, but in reality, I would probably take *The Almost Sisters* by Joshilyn Jackson. It's an endearing novel that will make you laugh and cry in the same sitting, and I like to read it when I'm stressed - and I can't think of anything more stressful than being stuck on a desert island!

Any hobbies or interests outside the library?

My favorite thing to do right now is laying in my hammock on my back porch with the tiki torches lit. But when it's raining, I like to spend time with my husband and our dogs and cat, usually playing a board game. I also enjoy hiking, kayaking, and traveling when I'm able!

Union Rotary Donates Color Printer to Union Branch

he Union Rotary Club has donated a color printer to the Union branch of Scenic Regional Library for patron use. The printer was purchased with funds from a \$1,550 Community Assistance Program (CAP) grant. The printer was installed on October 3. Color prints cost \$0.35 cents per page.

Rotary is a service organization consisting of a global network of 1.4 million neighbors, friends, leaders, and problem-solvers who see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change across the globe.

The library plans to purchase color printers/copiers for all branches in 2024.

Blood Pressure Home Monitoring Kits Now Circulating


Scenic Regional Library and the American Heart Association have collaborated to add Blood Pressure Home Monitoring Kits to Scenic Regional Library's collection of non-traditional items. Each kit contains a blood pressure cuff and monitor, a blood pressure log, and an information pamphlet.

Library Provides Drop Off Locations for Warners' Warm-Up Coat Drive



The library's Franklin County branches will serve as drop-off locations for this year's annual Warners' Warm-Up Coat Drive. The organization is requesting donations of new or gently used coats of all sizes—for men, women, and especially children.

This year's two-week collection period will begin on October 23 and continue until November 5.

Former St. Louis Rams quarterback Kurt Warner and his wife Brenda launched the coat drive in 2001 as a one-day drive before a Rams game. It has evolved into a two-week St. Louis metropolitan area-wide effort with hundreds of drop-off locations on both sides of the river. The Warners' Warm-up Coat Drive collects over 15,000 coats each year.


The Life of Carl Lutz Program

The Warrenton branch of Scenic Regional Library and the St. Louis Kaplan Feldman Holocaust Museum will host a program about the life of Carl Lutz, a former student at Central Wesleyan College in Warrenton, on Tuesday, November 28 at 6 p.m., at the Warrenton branch.

Lutz is highlighted in episode three of Ken Burns' newest acclaimed documentary, The U.S. and the Holocaust, and was also featured on Nine PBS on Living in St. Louis for Holocaust Remembrance Day in honor of the anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising.

Lutz arrived in Warrenton from Illinois





to study the ministry. He changed his mind about the ministry and became a diplomat for his native Switzerland. He is credited with saving more than 62,000 Jewish people from deportation to Nazi concentration camps as he served as the Swiss Vice-Consul in Budapest, Hungary, from 1942 through the end of World War II. It is considered the largest civilian rescue mission during the Holocaust.

Warren County Canned Food Drive




Throughout November, the Warren County Democratic Central Committee will host a canned food collection drive at the
