# "The Flower Sisters" Chosen as 2025 Community Read

f I he 2025 Community Read Selection Committee has chosen "The Flower Sisters" by Michelle Collins Anderson as next year's title! Each year, Scenic Regional Library partners with Washington Public Library and East Central College to host an annual Community Read. The goal is to have as many people reading and discussing the same book at the same time. Over four weeks, the library and its partners will distribute over 1,000 free copies and present many programs that relate to the book's themes. The next Community Read will take place in April, 2025.



### Summary:

Drawing on the little-known true story of a tragic event that took place in the author's Missouri hometown at an Ozarks dance hall in 1928, this beautifully written novel, told through twin storylines fifty years apart, explores the unpredictable effect of split-second decisions, small-town tragedy, and the ways family secrets reverberate through generations. Sure to resonate with fans of Daniel Woodrell, Donna Everhart, Ellen Marie Wiseman, and Jeannette Walls. At birth, Violet and Rose Flowers were identical, save for a tiny bluish-purple mark gracing Violet's slender neck. By nineteen, their temperaments distinguish them, as different as the flowers their mother named them for-Violet, wild and outgoing, and Rose, solitary and reserved. Still, they are each other's world. Then, on a sweltering, terrible August night in 1928, an explosion rocks Lamb's Dance Hall in Possum Flats, Missouri, engulfing it in flames, leaving one twin among the dozens dead, and her sister's life forever changed. Fifty years later, Daisy Flowers is dumped on her grandmother Rose's doorstep for the summer. A bright, inquisitive fifteen-year-old, Daisy bargains her way into an internship at the local newspaper—where she learns of the mysterious long-ago tragedy and its connection to her family. Rose, now the local funeral home director, grows increasingly alarmed as her impulsive granddaughter delves into Possum Flats' history, determined to uncover the horrors and heroes of the fiery blast. For a small town, Possum Flats holds a multitude of big secrets, some guarded by the living, some kept by the dead. And through Rose, Daisy, Dash—a preacher who found his calling that fateful night—and others, those ghosts gradually come into the light, forcing a reckoning at last.



# Library Releases 2023-2024 Annual Report



The library has released its annual report for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, which ended June 30. Among this year's highlights were a visit from Governor Mike Parson at the Union branch; a performance of "Give 'em Hell, Harry" by Clifton Truman Daniel, Harry Truman's grandson; and the three exhibits at The

Gallery at the Library in the Hermann branch: "Portraiture," "Winter Eden," and "At Play."

The library showed high usage throughout the year, with many increases. Over 368,000 people visited the library's nine branches, and 6,730 new library cards were issued. In addition, the library checked out 462,813 physical items and 265,823 digital items, such as e-books and e-audiobooks. The total number of digital checkouts reflects a 33.67% increase from 2022-2023.

The library checked out 4,695 non-traditional items such as telescopes, headphones, cake pans, microscopes, WiFi hotspots, and Chromebooks, and added blood pressure kits and Tonieboxes to the collection. In 2023-2024, the library offered 606 adult programs, reaching 7,874 people, a 20.4% increase from the previous year, and 983 children and teen programs attended by 25,591 people. Library staff also facilitated 212 visits to

3,383 senior citizens at nursing homes and senior centers in all three counties.

The fiscal year also saw the third annual Community Read, an event designed to encourage discussion by having as many people as possible read the same book simultaneously. The book chosen for the 2024 Community Read was "Harry Truman's Excellent Adventure: The True Story of a Great American Road Trip" by Matthew Algeo. In addition, two other books were chosen for middle-grade students and children to involve all ages in the event: "The Great Turkey Walk" by Kathleen Karr and "Road Trip!" by Claudia Friddell. The library and its partners gave away 2,136 free copies of all three books to the public and area schools. Over four weeks, the Community Read saw 86 themed programs with 1,647 attendees.

## Changes to Hoopla for Reciprocal Borrowers



Beginning November 1, Scenic Regional Library's reciprocal cardholders will no longer be able to access Hoopla. The decision was made to curb skyrocketing costs for the digital platform. Hoopla's annual fee is based on usage, which has caused many public libraries nationwide to struggle to afford the popular product. Since Scenic Regional introduced Hoopla in 2015, the annual cost has skyrocketed from \$15,000 to \$106,000. Over the past year, over 41,000 items were checked out through the platform.

Reciprocal cardholders are residents of Heartland Regional, Missouri River Regional, St. Charles City-County, St. Louis County, Crawford County (excluding Sullivan), and Washington County libraries. The change will not impact any Washington residents, including those living in the Washington Public Library District, nor households purchasing a Scenic Regional library card.

Hoopla offers over 1.5 million digital audiobooks, books, comics and manga, music, movies, TV, and more.


Genres: Romance, Contemporary, Fiction



# Library Provides Drop Off Locations for Warners' Warm-Up Coat Drive



The library's Franklin County branches will serve as drop-off locations for this year's annual Warners' Warm-Up Coat Drive. The organization is requesting donations of new or gently used coats of all sizes—for men, women, and especially children.

This year's two-week collection period will begin on October 21 and continue until November 2.

Former St. Louis Rams quarterback Kurt Warner and his wife Brenda launched the coat drive in 2001 as a one-day drive before a Rams game. It has evolved into a two-week St. Louis metropolitan area-wide effort with hundreds of drop-off locations on both sides of the river. The Warners' Warm-up Coat Drive collects over 15,000 coats each year.
