Kramer said she also intends to expand swim lesson and exercise class offerings.

"I have sent out a survey to find out what parents and families are wanting, as far as days and times, so that we can accommodate what they want," she explained.

To encourage more people to sign up, Kramer said the aquatic center is putting a discount on class sign-ups for

pool members.

Group swim lessons have been reorganized for different age groups and experience levels, beginning Oct. 13.

For "Aquacise" water aerobics classes, there are morning, afternoon and evening times throughout the week.
