

Lindsley Appointed to Library Board



Martha Lindsley, Library Trustee for Crawford County

The Crawford County Commission has appointed Sullivan resident Martha Lindsley to serve on the Scenic Regional Library Board of Trustees. Ms. Lindsley will fill the remainder of the four-year term vacated by Leonard Butts, who resigned on August 6. The term expires on June 30, 2023.

Ms. Lindsley is a Sullivan branch library user and retired business owner. She operated Mid-Missouri Transportation, a medical transportation business, in Sullivan for thirteen years with her husband. Previously, she was coordinator of the Parents as Teachers program in the Sullivan School District for ten years.

When the Sullivan Municipal Library joined Scenic Regional Library in 2015, about one-third of the new territory was located in Crawford County. As a result, a trustee was appointed from the area to represent its residents on the Scenic Regional Library Board.

Library Board Votes to Move Ahead with New Hermann Branch

At their August 25 meeting, the Scenic Regional Library Board of Trustees voted unanimously to move ahead on plans for a new facility in Hermann. In February, the Library Board selected Horn Architects, located in Washington, to design the facility. However, the contract was tabled twice (in March and June) due to the library's uncertain finances in 2021 due to COVID. The contract with Horn Architects was approved at the August meeting.

The library purchased a 25,000 sq. ft. vacant building (the former Alco store building) in the Bavarian Hills Shopping Center in 2019 to renovate in Hermann. The library plans to convert approximately

one-third of the building into the new library, while seeking tenants for the remaining space. The final design will be completed and presented to the Library Board for final approval in February 2021. The library expects to begin construction on the project later in 2021.

The Hermann facility will be the final component of the library system's \$22 million system-wide building project, which began in 2016. New or expanded and renovated facilities in Warrenton, Wright City, Owensville, New Haven, Pacific, Sullivan, and St. Clair were opened between May and September 2018. The new Union branch and administrative offices were opened in August 2019.



The Yarbough family from New Haven donated 200 Wilton cake pans to the library. The donation will more than double the library's collection, increasing it from 137 cake pans to 337. The library began checking out cake pans in April 2019. The donated cake pans will be divided up and distributed to all the library's branches.

Library Now Offering Mobile Hotspots

Scenic Regional Library now has mobile hotspots available for checkout at all branches. The purpose of the mobile hotspots is to provide free wireless Internet at home for people to use with their laptop or mobile device. People can use the Internet access for a wide range of needs, from telehealth (doctor's appointments) and virtual meetings to distance learning and emailing.

The devices will check out for 2 weeks, with no renewals allowed. Patrons can place a hold or request on a hotspot if they're all checked out.

The first 42 devices arrived at the branches in late August. The remaining 12 will be placed within the next few weeks. If demand warrants, the library will add 36 additional devices this fall, which would increase the total available to 90.

The library received funds (\$15,000) through a CARES Act grant which will fund the data costs for 42 of the 90 mobile hotspots in FY2020-2021. A second CARES Act grant is pending, which will fund an additional 12 devices.

While there is no cost to the library for the actual devices; the data costs are \$30 per month for each device. The carrier is T-Mobile. After FY2020-2021, the Library will have to fund the full data costs for all 90 devices, as the grant funding will end. The total data costs will be \$32,400 for FY2021-2020.

Many public libraries across the country and state have been taking advantage of CARES Act funding and adding mobile hotspots this summer.



Library Launches "1,000 Books Before Kindergarten"

On September 1, the library will launch a free program which encourages parents to read 1,000 books with their children before they start kindergarten.

Studies have shown that a parent reading with their child provides a great opportunity for bonding. Reading together is also fun and creates life-long memories, whether they are reading books they own, picking them out on a visit to the library, or downloading them onto an e-reader device. Experts agree that children who learn the necessary skills early do better in school and later in life. Participating in



"1,000 Books Before Kindergarten" can help put a child on the right track.

While reading 1,000 books may sound like a daunting task, it's much easier than one may think. If a parent and child read just one book a night, they will read 365 books in a year. In two years, the number will grow to 730. In the third year, they will surpass the goal at 1,095 books. Considering that most children start kindergarten at age 5 or 6, they have more than enough time to complete the challenge.

Parents can either visit their local Scenic Regional Library branch and pick up a reading log, or go to https://scenicregional.org/1000-books-before-kindergarten/ and register online. Each time 100 books are read the parent and child can stop by their local branch to pick up a sticker for that page in their reading log.

After reading 1,000 books, a child will receive a "color-your-own" book bag that they can decorate to proudly carry their library books. The parent and child will also be featured in the library's newsletter and social media pages. Best of all, they will feel the pride of accomplishment of reaching this goal together.


Microscopes Available at the Library for Checkout

Scenic Regional has seven Nikon Alphaphot microscopes available for checkout. Each microscope includes a set of twenty-five prepared slides, which contain samples of plants, insects, and animal tissues. They can be used to view a dog cardiac muscle, honeybee worker leg, human blood, pine leaf, sunflower stem, and many other specimens. The library also has 100-slide kits with even more specimens that can be checked out separately.

The microscopes are a great opportunity for children or adults who have a strong personal interest in science, or even for families who are homeschooling and want to incorporate another STEM element into their curriculum.

The microscopes check out for two weeks and have a \$5.00 per day overdue fee. The library has been checking out other specialty items for a few years, including cake pans, fishing poles, binoculars, and telescopes.

The microscopes were donated to the library by East Central College. The library plans to add two more to its collection in the coming weeks.

Additional COVID Restrictions at Wright City Branch

Due to its proximity to the Wright City Middle School, the library has imposed some additional COVID-related restrictions at the Wright City branch after school. During the school year, the branch can have as many as 50 to 60 middle school students in the building after school. Due to the size of the branch, the amount of traffic during the hours after school created concerns.



As a result, the library will limit the building capacity at the branch to 20 people at a time after school. In addition, visitors will be limited to 30 minutes on the public computers,

and an hour in the building. A staff member will be stationed at the entrance to manage building capacity.

The restrictions will only be on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, from 2:15 to 5:00 PM; and Wednesdays from 1:15 to 5:00 PM (due to an early release on Wednesdays). School in Wright City began on August 24.

The library received an art donation from Bob Hansen, former owner of the Hansen Abstract Office in Union, for the Union branch. The piece, entitled "The Readers", was carved by a Zimbabwean artist for an exhibit at the Missouri Botanical Gardens in 2001.

Mr. Hansen's mother helped organize the first lending library in Union in the 1930's, along with other P.E.O. FO Chapter in Union members. She also served on the Union library's original Board of Directors. The library was originally located on the upper floor of the Hansen Abstract Office building, owned by Mr. Hansen's father.
