The Scenic Regional Library will join libraries throughout the United States in celebrating National Library Week April 21 to 27. This year's theme is "Be All You Can Be-Read". Special events and exhibits are planned for the celebration in all libraires in the Scenic Regional Library System.

The Warrenton Study Club and the Coummunity Betterment Association will sponsor an openhouse at the Warrenton Library on Tuesday, April 23 from 7:30 to 9 p.m. Col. E.P. Streck, president of the Scenic Regional Library board and amember of the Lewis and Clark Trail Committee of Missouri will discuss the committee's work after the showing of the film "The Journals of Lewis and Clark.;; According to Mrs. A.M. Hafner, Warrenton library has 10,070 books circulating. Of this number, she said, 3,602 are assigned books, 262 are reference books and 6,468 are from the revolving collectin.

Books added during 1967, Mrs. Hafner explained, include 1,102 in the revolving collection, 184 assigned books and 31

reference books.

The library received 33 diff-

erent magazines.

Circulation statistics, Mrs. Hafner said, amount to 11,109 adult books and 13,223 juvenile books. Other materials include 41 view master reels, 618 phonograph records, 1.077 magazines, 45 vertical file, 73 framed pictures and nine prints.

She said there were 110 family registrations during 1967.
