At the group's meeting in December, they discussed "The Seamstress" by Allison Pittman. The story "breathes life into the cameo character from the classic novel 'A Tale of Two Cities," the book's description on Amazon says.

It allowed readers in Warrenton to go back to the days of the French Revolution, but to see it from a different perspec-

It was a bit smaller of a group than normal who came to the library Dec. 27 to discuss the story, Schaefferkoetter said, largely because the group met just after Christmas and just before New Year's. The weather didn't help either. But she said they also don't want the group to get too big.

She said headquarters thinks these types of groups shouldn't get bigger than 12 people.

"More than that gets too restrictive," she said. "Everybody doesn't get the chance to talk and some dominate a little bit and others don't say as much."

The group discussing "The Seamstress" was

were able to contribute to a conversation that lasted almost an hour.

Usually, once the discussion finishes, the group colors in the most recent country they "visited." That didn't happen at this meeting because the group had already read a story set in France, which is one of 16 countries they've been to.

The Literary Travelers group have discussed stories set on four continents – North America, Europe, Africa, and Asia – and are hoping to add South America and Australia in the near future.

"We just enjoy traveling around the world," Schaefferkoetter said.

The next book they are reading, "Girl in Ice" by Erica Ferencik, is set on Norwegian islands in the Arctic Circle. They'll discuss that story at the Jan. 24 meeting.

Schaefferkoetter said anyone wishing to join the group simply needs to stop by the library and check out the book.

"Then they just show up on the fourth Wednesday at 2:00," she said.

She also said that, even though the group is small, there is still enormous benefit to the community.

"I think anytime you can give purpose to people of all ages and keep them actively engaged.

get board approval to do it. Obviously, we've got to do some front loading work."

Berger stressed the plan provides guidance on how the district will address future capacity challenges. He said the early parts of the plan are more certain than the long range timelines. The plan will be revisited annually for course correction as new information is available, Berger said.

The district's proposal in the master plan includes proceeding in fiscal year 2030 with renovating the current high school, which will no longer be in use at that time. The district plans to vacate the current high school and move into the new high school
