Handicapped Clothing Books Presented To Scenic Library

Men, women and children with physical limitations and their families can gain insights to new independence in their daily lives with the help of two new books at the Scenic Regional Library branch in Warrenton.

Helen Schuman, president of the Warren County Extension Homemakers Association, and Martha Bowen, area extension home economics specialist, presented the books, for physically limited and elderly residents of Warren County, to the Scenic Regional

Library last week.

"Independent Living For the Handicapped and the Elderly," by May, Waggoner and Hotte, is a one-of-a-kind "here's how" book.

The second book, "Clothing Resources For the Physically Limited Adults and Children" is a reference compiled by Bowen.

The book on independent living covers fashionable clothing design to disguise disabilities, work simplification for lowenergy problems and care of young children by parents who have physical limitations.

The reference compiled by Bowen has a section denoted methods adopting clothing for dicapped disabilities and disfigurements, a section of sample catalogs denoted to specialty clothing and aids or appliances for the handicapped and a reference for ordering catalogs and literature for home use.
