Running for the northern commissioner seat, the Warren County Insurance Foundation will award a \$2,000 scholarship to a graduate of Wright City School District. Shelter Agent Kelly Hill sponsors and partially funds this scholarship.

A committee of local high school officials and community leaders will select the local recipient. The committee will consider each applicant's scholastic achievements, educational goals, citizenship, moral character and participation and leadership in school and

will face off in the August primary elections. The winners of the primaries will move on to general elections in November, although they aren't likely to face additional competition. The scholarship is given without regard to race, disability, religion, national origin or gender of applicants. The name of the recipient will be announced at the close of the school year.

The student may apply the scholarship funds toward tuition, fees, or campus housing for any course of study beginning the fall after the recipient's high school graduation and leading to an academic degree at any accredited college or uni-
