Two businesses applied for only dispensaries in one of Warrenton's busiest commercial areas. New Growth Horizon LLC wants to dispense medical marijuana from the former Hardee's building at 711 N. Highway 47. Across the street, QPS Missouri Holdings LLC applied to operate a dispensary in the former BP gas station building at 714 N. Highway 47.
